Neighbourhood Plan News

We're about to do the big survey of village opinion. Survey forms will be delivered to each household shortly.

What's in the survey? A whole range of issues such as traffic, wildlife, housing, village activities, heritage, recreation and tourism.

Will anybody take any notice of it? Yes, because our Neighbourhood Plan will eventually become a legal document under the Localism Act (2011) and must be used as a guide if any changes are to be made in the village.

Can everyone be involved in drawing up the Plan? Yes! This is why we're doing the survey, so you can tell us your thoughts about the village and what your ideas and hopes are for the future. It's important, so we need to get the Plan right. Over 80 people came to our launch earlier this year so people are being involved already.

We hope that everybody in the village will complete this survey so there's a survey form for **each person aged 16 and over**, not just one per household. This is because people have differing views, often related to their age or circumstances.

We particularly want younger people to complete a form, as otherwise their thoughts and hopes won't be heard as much as they should. Later this year we'll be separately asking the views of the under-16s and their parents. Please would all parents encourage their youngsters to take part.

Will I be able to do the survey on-line? Yes, and we would prefer it if you did. The questions are the same. It'll be easier to do on a laptop or tablet, rather than a mobile. When the survey forms are delivered to your house go to our website www.np4nb.online and click the survey button

Oh yes, and everyone who completes a survey form (paper or online) is entered in a free prize draw! One prize of £25 in cash for each of these age groups: 16–24yrs and over 25yrs.

Old Buckenham Metal-Detecting Rally

The Norfolk Heritage Recovery Group will be holding a charity metaldetecting rally in Old Buckenham on Sunday 6th August, and all proceeds from the event will be donated to the Raise The Roof appeal.

The rally will take place at Old Hall Farm in Harlingwood Lane. The fields to be metal-detected are situated between the site of Buckenham old castle on Abbey Road and the new castle just outside New Buckenham. The organisers are hopeful of recovering some interesting items of buried heritage from Old Buckenham's distant past.

If anyone is interested to see what's discovered, there will be a display of finds at the Registration Point situated at Old Hall Farm buildings in Harlingwood Lane. The display will be available to view between 2:00pm and 4:00pm and there will be someone from NHRG on hand to identify the finds and explain their significance.

Afterwards, any artefacts recovered will be taken to the Finds Liaison Officer at Norfolk County Council's Historic Environment Service where they will be identified and recorded on the national Portable Antiquities Scheme database.

Waveney Food Bank Collection Point

One in five people are living below the poverty line in the UK and not just in the poor urban areas we see on the news. Here in rural south Norfolk it is shocking to realise that sudden redundancy, benefit delay, loss of self-employed income or family breakdown can happen to anyone, and parents are going hungry to feed their children or pay the rent.

The Waveney Foodbank is part of the Trussell Trust, a UK-wide network which also offers support with housing, family issues and mental health problems. The trust helps local churches and communities to open food banks to help local people in crisis.

We have set up a food bank collection point just inside the door at St Martin's church, where leaflets are available with more information and lists of suggested items. Sue Cattermole at Kings Stores has also kindly offered to keep any items bought there until we can pick them up. Every little helps - thank you!
