Murder on the Orient Express (12a)

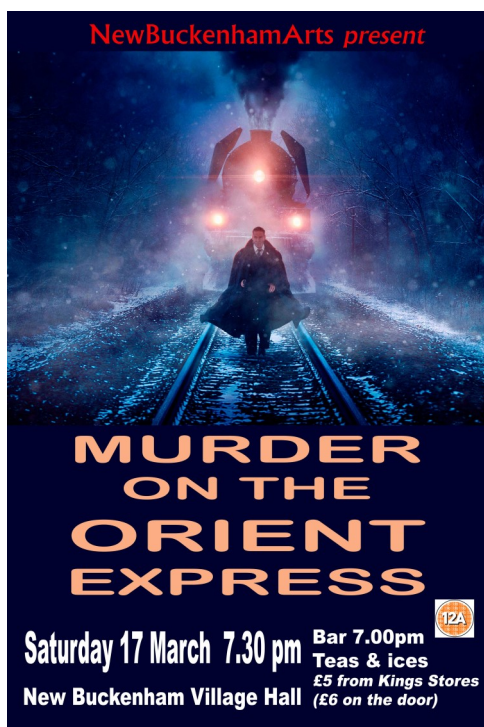
We need to swap round our films in March and April due to a very recent decision by the film distributors to restrict non-theatrical screenings of *The Party* in the month following the DVD release. Thus we will now be showing *The Party* on 28th April and *Murder on the Orient Express* on Saturday 17th March, so not as announced at our January film night.

Our very first screening, six years ago almost to the day, was also *Murder on the Orient Express* – the 1974 version starring Albert Finney. So it is apt that we revisit the story now, in a new version starring and directed by Kenneth

Branagh, who leads an all-star cast including Penelope Cruz, Judi Dench, Michelle Pfeiffer, Olivia Colman, Derek Jacobi and Johnny Depp. Based on Agatha Christie's novel, which tells the tale of 13 strangers stranded on a train where everyone is a suspect. What starts out as a lavish train ride through Europe quickly unfolds into a suspenseful and thrilling mystery. One man must race against time to solve the puzzle before the murderer strikes again.

Tickets (£5) are on sale at Kings Stores and on the website wegottickets.com, or can be reserved by calling 861114. The door price is £6. Doors open at 7pm and the programme starts at 7:30pm. As usual there will be a bar, tea and coffee. Ice-creams will be sold during the interval.

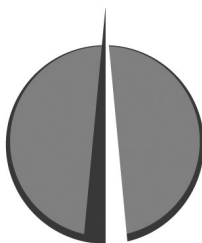

Summary of Draft Minutes February 2018

1. Apologies Cllrs Chirodian, Dowson and Highton.
2. PC resolved to approved draft Minutes of January meeting.
3. Street Lighting Project

Council considered Clerk's report on the light attached to Dial House, which identified a shortfall in the annual reimbursement to Mr and Mrs Elvin because it is wired into their domestic power supply. It was resolved that a one off payment of £59.57 be made in recognition of electricity supplied since 2010. The Clerk agreed to meet with Mrs Highton on site with regard to glare from the light opposite her house with a view to provide shielding to eliminate glare.

4. Public Participation

a) District Cllr Report

Cllr Joel briefed members on the timetable for the examination in Public of the Breckland Local Plan. Norfolk Waste Partnership has issued a reminder that nappies should not be placed in recycling bins.

- b) Cllr Bingham raised the issue of potholes. Clerk agreed to email Highways for an update, copied to County Councillor Askew.

5. Financial Matters

- a) Financial Report for January received.

- b) Payments for February approved

6. Planning

Council considered a response to a planning application for The Beams, King Street. Resolved to register an objection because although alterations to the house were acceptable it was considered the garage as designed was capable of being used as a separate dwelling.

7. Neighbourhood Plan

A grant of £4,140 has been received, £3,925 for consultancy costs, £60 for room hire. Focus Group meetings are taking place on 26th February and 5th March, and a Village Meeting on 28th April.

8. Amenities

- a) Cemetery: Cllr Bingham agreed to produce drawings from the topographical survey.
- b) Allotments: they are now fully occupied.
- c) Closed Churchyard: agreed the new management plan to be incorporated within the contract with Broadland Tree Services.
- d) Play Area: pressure washing of equipment will be done on an annual basis.
- e) Cricket Pitch: Clerk has discussed ground maintenance contract with Broadland Tree Services with a view to a more realistic rental for the CC. Council agreed it should pay for twice monthly grass cutting during the season with the CC paying for any additional cuts. Clerk agreed to circulate proposals to Councillors.

9. Projects

- a) Community Car Scheme: well supported, 12 drivers now available.
- b) Notice Board: Cllr Bingham agreed to investigate having a Village Map drawn up for placing on the board.

10. Clerk

Councillors agreed in principle to raise hours to 9 per week, but to defer final decision to the next meeting following clarification of the activity log.
