New Buckenham Players 28th–30th June

Gloriously non-PC and hilarious, this farce could only have been set in the Swinging Sixties, when jet travel and air hostesses were fun and glamorous.

In his Paris flat (and with help from his long-suffering housekeeper) playboy architect Bernard juggles three fiancées, working for different airlines, relying on their flight timetables to keep them all apart. But things get complicated when new, faster aircraft come into service and the timings change. Will all the girls be in Paris at the same time? And will his friend Robert, who has come to stay, back Bernard up in his schemes - or does he have plans of his own?

The piece calls for skillful direction, split-second timing and deft line delivery and the company was fully up to those demands. More than that, and most importantly, each of the cast vividly brought out the personality of their particular character – the contrast between them lying at the heart of the comedy.


New Buckenham Parish Council

Rare Bat Hanging Out in New Buckenham!

The Barbastelle is one of Britain's rarest bats and it's an endangered species, but it's here in New Buckenham. It even has a 'Species Action Plan' created by the Government to protect it.


As part of our Neighbourhood Plan, we have joined the British Trust for Ornithology's ground-breaking Norfolk Bat Survey, to establish what's whizzing round where: <http://www.batsurvey.org/>

We've monitored Barbastelles around the castle, the church, over the common, on St Martin's Gardens and close to the houses on the south side of the village near the old town ditch. There are 18 bat species in the UK. We have recorded at least 9 of them across the village in May, June and July this year in 27 different locations. Bats are increasingly regarded by naturalists as a good gauge of a healthy wildlife environment.

Watch out for these too: Noctules, Daubentons, Brown long-eared bats, Natterer's bats, Serotines, Pipistrelles, Soprano Pipistrelles, Whiskered or Brandt's bats. The

Norfolk Wildlife Trust said 'Excellent news. What good results!' The BTO said we were doing pretty well in the bat league. Dr Stuart Newson, who set up the project and masterminds it from the BTO's Thetford headquarters, said 'In terms of species, at least, there's not much more that could be recorded!'

New Buckenham Easter Art Exhibition

Well, what a fantastic long weekend it was! Many debutant artists who brought a new feel, lots of visitors, lots of pictures sold and lots of lovely cakes!

We had a record year with the event making a staggering £4,633 – this was due to a combination of quality exhibits, plenty of buyers and for the first time the ability to take card payments (many thanks to Andrew Bingham for arranging this through the Village Hall Trust – I know that process was far from straight forward). The profit is split between the church and the Village Hall, and cheques have already been distributed.

Over the years the Art Ex has raised almost £73,000 for these village causes, an incredible amount for little ol' New Buckenham!

If anyone would like a copy of the figures, please let me know as there is too much information on the spreadsheet to display it effectively in the *Parish News*.

As you would expect, it takes a lot of effort to stage and a lot of work is put in by the Art Ex committee, especially Hazel, Clive and Gill, who take great care with the exhibition. We were also very glad to welcome Pauline Dynes aboard this year who is a valuable addition to the team.

Many thanks if you exhibited, bought, visited or helped out over the weekend and we hope to see you all next year!
