New Buckenham's First World War Commemorative Roll of Honour Restored

"We shall remember them"

In St Martin's Church is a brass memorial to those who gave their lives in the First (1914—1918) World War, 100 years ago. It followed a paper Roll of Honour which hangs nearby. To mark the anniversary I am glad to say the paper Roll of Honour has been taken down, professionally cleaned and preserved. It commemorates those who went to war and of course those who gave their lives and didn't come home.

When the restorer removed it from the frame, an older or original 'working copy' found headed was 'Those on active service', i.e. written during WW1, whereas the later one is entitled 'List of those who served'. On the older one some names are boxed round in pencil, presumably as news of those who fell was being received ลร war progressed, whereas the boxing is black in the smart version. The brass plaque came later on.

As the hand written

'working copy' is perhaps an unusual survivor, I have now had it also mounted and framed with an explanatory note and the two will soon be hanging together again, as some names are being added to the post-war version.

Several well-known family names appear (Aldous, Saunders, Maggs, Westgate and others). Certainly I remember Hubert and Wilfred Saunders well, although it seems Wilfred didn't go, others would have been in protected occupations like farming and suchlike, but they risked criticism for it.

Also I think worthy of mention is that listed separately from the men is my grandmother, Sister K. (Katie) Westgate. Females on active service were rare. She was a nursing sister who served on a hospital and troop ship at Gallipoli with Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service Reserve 'QAIMNSR', tending the wounded who were brought aboard for treatment. One can only imagine the horrors she like so many others witnessed. She survived and married my grandfather in St Martin's Church on 8th October 1920.

Therefore, as well as remembering all those who served, my contribution to New Buckenham's marking of the 100th anniversary of the First World War, has a personal element too, in respect of my grandparents. I'm also grateful to Helen Pearson and Revd Canon Steve Wright's wife, who I understand arranged to fetch and carry the Roll of Honour for restoration.

Wildlife - What and Where?

We know from last year's survey of residents' opinion that the wildlife in and around our village is dear to many hearts. There's lots of anecdotal evidence of uncommon species such as great crested newts and water voles, and most us have seen hedgehogs, barn owls and bats. But what do we have, and where are the protective habitats for these species?

The Neighbourhood Plan project has commissioned a formal wildlife appraisal of the village and its surroundings, to be done by a professional ecologist. This is funded by a government grant, so it's at no cost to the village.

Apart from trawling through national and county records, the ecologist will visit us in September to 'tread the ground'. We plan to meet the ecologist the same morning to discuss the appraisal. Everyone with an interest in our wildlife is welcome to join us for 30-45 this meeting which will last about minutes. Before then however the ecologist would like to tap into our local knowledge! A survey will be emailed to as many addresses as we have, and survey forms will also be at King's Stores. If you have information about our protected and special wildlife, please let us know. The survey takes less than five minutes to complete and all information is vital to our research. We do hope you can help.

The meeting with the ecologist is at 10:00am prompt on Tuesday 25th September at the Village Hall.


