Men of the Village who died in the Great War

Herbert Land and his brother Ernest of New Buckenham joined the army to go to the Great War. Both were fortunate to survive and their names join the 125 others in the Roll of Honour displayed in various versions in St Martin's Church. The brothers' details were researched by Herbert's grandson Evan Waite who then researched the war details of the 16 men who had given their lives.

Evan's results are compiled in his book New Buckenham - the supreme sacrifice which, on 11 November, will be placed in St Martin's on permanent display. Note also in St Martin's a modest plaque showing the names of the 12 men of New Buckenham who gave their lives in WW2.

Summary of Draft Minutes October 2018

- 1. Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Chirodian.
- 2. Minutes of the September meeting were approved as correct.
- 3. Matters Arising
- a) Clerk has written to a resident regarding parking in Boosey's Walk, reply awaited.
- b) Planning Officer is looking into issues regarding Pickwick House, but not a high priority.
- c) Clerk was asked to contact Highways regarding overhanging trees in Marsh Lane and St Martin's Gardens.
- 4. Public Participation
- a) Parishioners' Comments and Questions.

A resident asked about the mobile phone signal and the condition of the former shop Lovells. Cllr Joel confirmed that permission had been granted for a mobile phone mast in Old Buckenham, expected construction shortly. Lovells was on the market and proposal for change of use would be down to the new owner.

- b) District Cllr Report
- i) Parish Councils have the right to register for 'Right to Bid' for village shops/pubs as community assets should they be put up for sale.
- ii) Breckland Council is writing to 1,800 properties who may be eligible for Government subsidy should their current broadband services fall under 2Mbps.

- 5. Planning
- a) Council considered a revision to the planning application for Beck Cottage, Grange Road which was now largely complete, for a car port, air source heat pump and landscaping - no objection.
- b) Planning decisions approved since last Parish Council meeting.
- i) replacement window frames, Thatched Cottage, Marsh Lane.
- ii) fenestration changes, The Forge, Market Place.
- 6. Financial Matters
- a) Resolved to note Bank Reconciliation to the end of September.
- b) Resolved to approve payments, noting that an additional payment to Broadland Services for extra work on Closed Churchyard would be deferred until next meeting.
- c) Resolved that budget monitoring report, July to September be noted.
- 7. Neighbourhood Plan

A further and final grant of £1,395 had been received from Locality, this will pay for the services of an architect to advise on the design review. There will be a public consultation event on November 3^{rd} . Clerk agreed to reply to a letter from Charles Stimpson.

- 8. Amenities
- a) Allotments: Allotment 16 is vacant but a new tenant is moving into the village shortly. Brian Knapett is giving up Plot 11 at the end of October.

- b) Closed Churchyard: Issues relating to revised grass cutting schedule will be discussed with BTS before the next meeting. Issues had been raised at the St Martin's PCC meeting, one was the proposal that a yew tree should be removed or heavily trimmed for security reasons. Resolved that the Clerk contact BTS for advice.
- c) Play Area: Playdale will be doing remedial repairs shortly and the issue of pressure washing will be raised with BTS.
- d) Cricket Club: Clerk has written regarding match day parking on the Common.
- e) Grounds Maintenance: Council expressed thanks to BTS for their swift action in removing fallen branches and a tree near the Play Area following a recent storm.
- 9. Projects
- a) Parish Noticeboard: A report from the Working Party at the next meeting.
- b) Community Car Scheme: Violet hoping to recruit new drivers.
- c) Community Project Fund: Application had been received from the Silver Band to be considered at the next Community Project Fund meeting.

Walk & Talk with the Architect

Saturday 3rd November

Building has always been going on in the village, whether brand new constructions or alterations, renovations and enlargements to existing homes. How this building is done is determined by the owner, the architect (if there is one) and the requirements of Breckland planning and building control. In New Buckenham's case, the Conservation Area status and whether or not the building is listed hold huge sway. In all this there can be inconsistencies between neighbouring district council policies.

Should the village itself have a view which could be expressed in the Neighbourhood Plan? Should the Plan guide the design of any new houses or major alterations? New houses could be on existing sites (such as the old garage) or new sites outside the constraints of the Conservation Area. Should the Plan say that new buildings should be of traditional materials or otherwise? How important is the space between houses and the ability to have green areas?

Do you have a view? Please come to our 'Walk and Talk with the Architect'. We'll walk around the village with an architect, point out what we like and don't like, and then discuss it all at the Village Hall. What we discuss will inform the Neighbourhood Plan, so come and let us hear your views and bring your camera!

Walk and Talk with the Architect is on Saturday 3rd November at 10.00am sharp starting at the Village Hall. After an hour's stroll around the village, we'll be back at the Village Hall for coffee and a discussion. Admission is free and all are welcome, young and old. We particularly look forward to seeing newcomers to the village.
