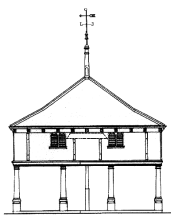

New Buck Speedsters?

20 mph or 200 mph on Church Street??!!

As so correctly identified in a recent Facebook discussion, the Neighbourhood Planning Team is indeed across this one. We have some answers but not, of course, solutions, since that will be the choice of the residents when the report is written up and everyone gets to vote on it. We are in the draft stage right now. Anyone wanting to make views known please do. Contact info@np4nb.online

In brief here are the facts: Speed and parking are at the top of the league table of angst issues. We've brought the Highways Dept here twice. Having 20 mph signs is a rarity. The police don't prioritise enforcement because it is regarded as being a "self-enforcing" limit. i.e. it's placed in locations where it is a "natural limit" e.g. where there are double bends, narrow roads, lots of parked cars. This also affects the parking problem. The argument goes : If you reduce on-street parking with e.g. double yellows, you effectively widen the roads and allow higher speeds.

We could have a flashing speed sign which is also portable so we could place it in any one of 3 locations BUT we have to pay. A "SAM2" (movable speed sign) costs up to £4,000. It may be possible to get matched funding. The positioning of such a sign is crucial - it mustn't block visibility from private driveways or the road, and the speed radar mustn't be inhibited by parked cars. There are so many other issues....but that's the start of it!.

So Little Time

Two phrases have struck me in the last month - “Tipping point” and “Stolen our future” The first was used by Sir David Attenborough in his chilling TV programme “Climate Change - the Facts” (still available on BBC IPlayer, I think) to indicate the point beyond which we would be unable to do anything more to influence or halt the rate of change when, for the next decade, there is a chance that action now could limit the rate to a manageable figure.

The second phrase was said by the brave Swedish teenager Greta Thunberg who initiated a worldwide school walkout, and herself met many heads of state in her efforts to promote action and raise awareness of the impending catastrophe facing our our fragile planet. The aptly named Extinction Rebellion march was organized by a committed group of people who were fed up with government talking but not acting and which did a lot to make the general public sit up and take notice.

Things are changing - discreetly, both at Government and private sector levels and investment is being put into renewable energy around the world. A number of states, including oil producing ones, are members of the International Renewable Energy Agency (IRENA) which promotes renewable sources and technologies as the key to a sustainable future, and their costs falling fast.

However, certain countries and private sector companies continue to exploit fossil fuels - think Donald Trump and the US, India and China and, most shockingly, Australia, where their recent general election bucked all predictions about electing a green- leaning Labour Government and re-elected the existing fossil fuel supporting one.

End of rant - but I feel passionately about Climate Change and next month I'll set out my thoughts on what we, as individuals, can do about it.

5. Matters Arising:

- a Costs for extra dog bins to be sought for the next meeting.
- b. Two-Wheel Tuesday.
- c. Overgrown trees in Marsh Lane. Clerk agreed to investigate the possibility of the Council arranging for them to be cut back due to the problem of establishing ownership.
Also in St Martin's Gardens.
- d. Clerk will arrange for the fence between the cemetery and the allotments to be replaced.
- e. Sponsorship of an edition of the Parish News to be put on June agenda.
