

Climate Change

Violet Highton recently wrote a pair of pieces in *Parish News* expressing her deep concern about the devastating effects of climate change on our children's and grand-children's futures. My neighbor, Jan Prior, and I were both strangely relieved to read her words. Like most people, our awareness of this evergrowing threat hanging over us had left us feeling increasingly helpless and overwhelmed. The problem seems too huge for ordinary individuals to comprehend, let alone resolve, while our politicians make the right noises, but do nothing. Violet's words — clear, urgent and utterly practical — literally brought this vast, amorphous problem home to our small beautiful rural corner of the world. She said: 'This is not going to go away. We ALL have to do something. Now!'

Jan and I went to meet Violet to discuss ways in which we could act on her concerns. Obviously many people in New Buckenham are already doing things individually, such as reducing the use of single-use plastic, car-sharing, growing their own veg. However, we agreed that the most effective way to combat our collective helplessness is to act together as a community. Jan, Violet and I have been especially inspired by a recent article in the *Guardian* on the 'mind-blowing' beneficial effects of planting trees (see link below).

According to scientists, planting billions of trees across the world is by far the simplest, cheapest and most effective way to tackle the climate crisis. A worldwide planting programme could remove two-thirds of ALL emissions pumped into the atmosphere by human activities. Planting trees is something we can all do right here and right now, in individual gardens, or collectively on common land. It could also act as a model for other villages to follow.

Primarily, we want to inspire renewed hope for the future. For this reason we especially want to involve New Buckenham's 60plus children and their families with our tree-planting project, and in a way that is theatrical, memorable, magical and fun. Jan and I would warmly welcome your ideas for this and any other innovative strategies that we could use to fight climate change here in our village.

Food Bank Summer Appeal

Village Footpaths

Appeal to all walkers with or without a dog!

New proposals to modernise the way in which Rights of Way are recorded have been approved by the Government. Currently all Rights of Way — footpaths and bridleways — are recorded on a Definitive Map of each village which began in 1949. All of the New Buckenham 'accepted' footpaths have been recorded on the Definitive Map, except one.

This omission is the short length of path leading from Marsh Lane, thorough the kissing gate between Thatched Cottage and Brook End, to the paths to the south of the village which lead towards Banham and Winfarthing or through the meadows to the Common. This path is marked with a Norfolk County Council fingerpost and is an accepted Right of Way, but has not been included on the Definitive Map. This need to be rectified before the cut-off date of 1st January 2026.

In order to establish continuous use as a footpath, evidence needs to be given to NCC Highways for them to amend the Definitive Map. It is important that this deadline is not missed as, although it seems a long way off, NCC have hundreds of applications to process and to lose an important access to footpath networks in the village would be a great shame. So, if you have walked the path in the past 20 years or before, please consider completing an Evidence of Use form, copies of which can be obtained from Mary Dowson, Karen Hobley or Barbara Cattermole (Flint Lodge, Marsh Lane). Help can be given to complete the form. At least a dozen completed forms will be needed from parishioners for this application to be considered.

The Parish Council is delighted that Barbara Cattermole, who has recently moved into the village and who already has experience in this area, has agreed to support us with this initiative. Many thanks, Barbara.

The Parish Council does not meet in August, but if any issues arise please feel free to contact me using the details below. The Parish Council has access to £480 from Breckland Council as part of Section 106 Agreements (usually referred to as planning obligations), which are legal agreements negotiated between Breckland Council and a developer or landowner who has been working within New Buckenham. This money is ringfenced for the provision of children's play and outdoor sports facilities in the village and we have to make a formal application to Breckland for the money to be released. As we are now enjoying the long summer holidays (teachers certainly are!), it would be great to hear from any youngsters in the village who may have some ideas on how we could spend it. Again, please contact me using the details below if you have any ideas for the Council to consider. Thank you.

- 3. Matters Arising: the following issues were outstanding and the Clerk agreed to progress each by the end of August:
 - a) overgrown trees in Marsh Lane;
 - b) replacement of the allotment fence;
 - c) investigate costs and implications of informal white lines outside Kings Stores;
 - d) costings, etc., for additional dog bins.

4. Public Participation

- a) District Cllr Askew asked Councillors to contact him by email with any problems.
- b) Parish Councillor Reports

Complaints have been received regarding the skip outside Lovells. Noted that skips on the highway were licensed by Norfolk County Council and there did not seem to be any breach of the licence.

The High Bailiffs Trust has offered a strip of Village Green to alleviate parking problems outside St Mary's. Funding would need to be found and the Clerk will contact Highways before the September meeting.

Cllr Dowson reported back from the SNAP meeting. Police priorities were to be speeding within the area and an initiative 'coffee with a cop' aimed at improving community engagement.

c) Parishioners' Comments and Questions

Concern regarding speeding along Church Street to the Village Hall, suggest extra signage. Noted that users of the Village Hall were being reminded of the village speed limit.

It was asked if the Lime tree in the Churchyard could be trimmed. Cllr Manning to ask Vicky Baker if they could deal with it

5. Financial Matters

- a) Financial report for June was noted.
- b) Council Insurance: the Clerk had two similar quotes for the coming year both less that the current year. Council resolved to agree to a three-year deal with Norris and Fisher for £546.76 for this year.
- c) Payments for July approved.

6. Planning

No new planning applications. Two applications approved by Breckland Council: Land off Cuffer Lane and Fair View, King's Street.

7. Section 106 Agreement

Noted that no monies would be forthcoming from the development of the garage site, but £480 had already been made available from another development for the provision of children's or sports facilities. It was decided to consult village opinion on possible projects (see above).

8. Rights of Way: Path in Marsh Lane

Mrs Barbara Cattermole drew attention to the fact that the path from Marsh Lane to the water-meadows was not on the Definitive Rights of Way Map. The deadline for getting this updated is 2026, therefore it was decided to gather evidence of usage to enable the path to be recognised as a Right of Way and included on the definitive map held by NCC. It was agreed to get Parishioners to submit evidence of past and present usage by completing a form. These forms will be held by Cllr's Hobley, Dowson and Mrs Cattermole, and further

information will be available in the *Parish News* (see page 14).

9. Two-Wheel Tuesday/Speeding

Cllr Bingham reported on the recent traffic study in the village. The data gave useful evidence of speeds of vehicles travelling through the village, although there was no evidence of any particular differences associated with Two-Wheel Tuesday. The police are aware of the event and are keeping an eye on any problems. Cllr's are to have an informal discussion with the Landlord of the Ox and Plough.

10. Neighbourhood Plan

Further comments were being sought from Breckland and the Town Planning Consultant. A workshop is to be held, the provisional date for which is 23rd September.

11. Community Project Fund Grant Application

Council agreed a grant application for £300 from the Junior Football Club for a new line-marker. Cllr Hobley to order the equipment and arrange for the invoice to be sent to PC.

12. Projects

- a) Parish Council Noticeboard: a meeting is being arranged with the designer.
- b) Community Car Scheme: Violet Highton has had a fall, but was still administering the scheme. Council expressed wishes for a speedy recovery.
