



Village Hall Update: Spring 2021

Some of you will have noticed the scaffolding on the roof of the Village Hall, which marks the start of the "Refurbish Our Village Hall" project.



The Trustees agreed to use the money from our recent bequests to invest in a building project which includes:

- Fixing the roof;
- Insulating, re-plastering, painting and decorating the Hall;
- LED lighting and new flooring for the entrance and the meeting rooms;
- Replacement of the external doors;
- Replacement of the fencing around the car park.

This is a major piece of work undertaken by the Trustees. Our Hall is 25 years old and it needed some attention — what better way to spend this time and our generous bequests than to make it a more comfortable and welcoming venue for the future?





 Council resolved that Andrew Nettleton be co-opted to serve as Parish Councillor. He confirmed his acceptance of the terms of the declaration of office and then participated in the meeting in his new capacity.

a) District/County Cllr Report

Cllr Askew outlined various forms of assistance available related to Covid 19. He undertook to investigate progress on the resurfacing of Marsh Lane.

c) Parish Councillor Reports

Concern was expressed about an increase in littering on the cricket pitch and parking on the verge near the Play area.

5. Financial Matters

- a) the financial report for February was received.
- b) payments for March were approved.
- c) Community Car Scheme: Gerry Walsh reported the grant from Breckland DC was approved. DBS and medical checks will be updated to enable the service to re-open when possible.

6. Planning

Application received: Beech House, Norwich Road: replacement of 11 windows, patio doors and two rear doors — no objection.

7. Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr Manning reported the draft NP is still with Breckland DC awaiting final comments.

8. Amenities

- a) Allotments
 - i) Allotment 12 has been cleared and is now available for tenants.

- ii) Cllrs agreed to discuss allotment agreements and rules at the next meeting.
- b) Cemetery: Cllrs agreed to discuss cemetery rules and policies at the next meeting.
- c) Market Place: Clerk presented two options for the replacement of litter bins on the Village Green and Play Area. Decision to be made at the next meeting after further research.

d) Closed Churchyard

- i) Phil Anderson will undertake remedial work on a yew tree near the church and remove an elder which will cause a problem to overhead wires.
- ii) Clerk has received a request from the landlords of The Cottage, Church Street for the PC to repair their boundary wall. Clerk will request the landlord to obtain quotations.

e) Play Area

- i) Spare parts for the repairs to the roundabout are on order.
- ii) Options for the installation of sensory play equipment to be discussed next meeting.
- f) Grounds Maintenance: Broadland Tree Services have agreed to extend their contract for up to three years.
