



### The Reverend Alan Wright

Alan was born on 21st April 1931, the youngest of four brothers living at Upgate Farm, Carleton Rode, just outside the parish boundary.

At Bracondale School, he was an enthusiastic sportsman, especially at cricket and football, and a life-long supporter of Norwich City. While Alan's two older brothers worked for the war effort, the two younger brothers kept the family farm running. After the war, Alan did his National Service in Colchester, serving in the Royal Medical Corps as ward orderly.

Alan never strayed far from his roots. He met Margaret, who was an Old Buckenham girl, and they married in 1954 in St Martin's church. They set up home in a cottage in Carleton Rode, but following the birth of Christine and Pauline they moved back into Upgate Farm, as his parents were unable to continue running the farm without help. Alan worked happily and successfully alongside his brother Archie all his working life.

Alan's son Andrew came along to complete the family and followed in the tradition of the Wright family, working with his dad on the farm. Alan played an active part in the running of the farm until his health restricted his ability to do much physical work, but he remained a 'back seat' farmer for many years.

The communities of Carleton Rode and New Buckenham played a big part in Alan's life. He was treasurer of the Carleton Rode Jubilee Hall Fund and gifted the plot of land on which the hall now stands.

Following encouragement by the St Martin's community in the 1990s Alan was ordained as a non-stipendiary minister. He was very active in the Farmers' Helpline, counselling many farmers who became depressed and lonely, a cause very close to his heart.



During his ministry Alan had to be a 'jack of all trades', sometimes preaching, playing the organ and singing in the choir. He said, "I played loudly and badly... and played all the right notes, but not always in the right order". Alan enjoyed preaching and was famous for his ability to get to the point and keep sermons short, especially if a family member was in the congregation. He was generous with his time, attending numerous New Buckenham functions and, quietly and diligently, visiting the sick at their homes.

Margaret and Alan were happily married for 67 years and his children never knowingly heard a cross word between them. He was a down to earth man who enjoyed family life, the countryside and country pursuits. Throughout his working life he was always accompanied by a springer spaniel, joining him in his tractor and following him wherever he went. When the children were older, Margaret and Alan began to travel with their dear friends John and Mary. They began at various bed and breakfasts in this country, usually on a farm, of course, finally venturing further afield to countries around the world bringing back many stories — and endless photographs.

Alan lived a full and contented life, he loved all his family—children, sons-in-law, grandchildren and great-grandchildren—and enjoyed the company of many friends.



## The Bench at the Cemetery Gates

My mother, Gwendolen Gray, nee Rutterford, lived with her family at Russell Lodge, Banham. She was born in November 1918. My father, Earle Gray, lived on a smallholding in one of the Lophams as a young child. His family moved to Hunt's Corner, Banham, later on. He was also born in November 1918. When I, Nanette, was born, my parents were living in Norwich, but they soon moved out to New Buckenham when my dad started to work for Jack Powell on his farm. We then lived in a tied cottage on the farm about a mile outside the village until my parents bought the semi-detached cottage in Chapel Street, which my mum later named Laverock. She told me this means 'skylark'. It must have been the early 1950's when we moved into the village, where I went to the village school which was still functioning then, having just two classes Infants (with Mrs Feltham) and Juniors (with Mrs Honeywood).

Mum played an active part in village life. In the early days she used to do a milk round pulling an old wooden cart. She became caretaker and cleaner at the old village hall, which was in Marsh Lane. She was a regular church goer and supporter, secretary of the Good Companions Club, member of the British Legion and Mothers' Union. She also did flower arranging and belonged to a group who did that. We must have been in Chapel Street in 1953, the year of the Coronation. Very few people had a television at that time. Quite a few of us were invited to the police house, where they did have a TV, to watch it. The village had celebrations for the Coronation, including a race around the common. My dad came third I believe! I also remember that he was able to rescue a young local boy from the Spittle Mere. I'm not sure which year possibly the really bad winter of 1962/3 – or who the boy was, but he had ventured onto the ice and he went a bit too far! Dad was very proud of the fact that he worked all his life – by which he meant that he was hardly ever without a job. He

might have lost one, but he quickly found another one! Different times! A lifelong supporter of the Canaries through thick and thin. He was also a lifelong supporter of both village pubs, especially the King's Head where he also, in his retirement, enjoyed membership of Compost Corner — a lunchtime gathering of local old boys who no doubt put the world to rights as well as the gardens. Sadly, the two pubs did not manage to support dad for all of his life. First, the King's Head closed followed by the George, which was, by then, really on its last legs. What a disaster, both for him and the community!

My parents lived in the village for the rest of their lives. Mum died in 1997 and dad in 2011. They are both buried in the cemetery. Ever since then, I have planned to install a bench in the village in their memory. My plan has been a long time in coming to fruition, but at last it is happening and you should see it soon.

My mum made good use of the old metal bench that was near the cemetery gates for all the time she lived in the village. She often sat there with one of her sisters, so it seems appropriate to replace it with a more up-to-date model. I hope it lasts as long as the old one and that people from the village and beyond make good use of it to enjoy a 'mardle' from time to time.

Parish Council meetings take place on the second Tuesday of every month with the exception of August when we don't usually meet. Our first meeting of 2022 will be on January 11th.



### Solve the Car Parking Crisis and be Green

## New Buckenham's own COP26 inspired carbon reduction project

Fed up with too many cars parked around the village? Is your car spending most of its time parked and not being used? Maybe you have your main family car and a second car — does the second car only get used for short journeys? Do you want the flexibility to jump in a car when you need it, but not have all the hassle and cost of owning, maintaining, taxing and insuring it?

The answer could be New Buckenham's very own shared car club scheme. An electric car available to signed-up members to use for short journeys, trips to Attleborough, school runs, etc. You may have heard of similar schemes such as Zipcar, Hiyacar and car2go. Users join the club and book online, members have an electronic tag or card that gives access to the car and are charged by the hour to your credit card. The scheme would be managed by a recognised car sharing club.

We would need to look at the best location for the car and provide a dedicated electric vehicle charging point. This could also provide one or two other charging points for private electric cars. With sufficient interest the Parish Council could give financial backing to get the project moving, but with the intention that it becomes self-financing.

The Parish Council are keen to promote the project, but in the first place we need to gauge interest, so please do get in contact, send me an email or message via the village Facebook page. Let me know if you would be interested in helping develop the project and promoting it in the village. Would you use a shared car and would it encourage you to dispose of your second car?
