Community Car Scheme

Are you interested in community voluntary work? Are you a car driver with some free time during the week, but not wanting a regular time commitment? If so, look no further than the community car scheme!

Since our scheme re-opened in October 2021, our seven volunteer drivers have completed 37 medically-related return journeys for parishioners, so I think that we can say we are fully operational again. However, the number of requests for drivers is on the increase as medical services are opening up post-pandemic. As a result, we are looking for new drivers to join us.

As a long-standing driver for the scheme I took up the task of Acting Co-ordinator on the behalf of the Parish Council, following the death of Violet Highton last year, in order to ensure the future of the scheme. However, this was only intended to be on a temporary basis and we are seeking someone to take over this role permanently.

New Buckenham Parish Council

Our February Parish Council meeting will take place on Tuesday 8th February at 7:30pm at the Village Hall. A warm invitation is extended to all parishioners.

A reminder that the agenda relevant to each meeting will be posted on the noticeboard on the Village Green and on the website (www.newbuckenhampc.info) where you will also find further information about the Parish Council.

Parish Council meetings take place on the second Tuesday of every month with the exception of August, when we don't usually meet. Dates for 2022 are 8th March, 12th April, 10th May, 14th June, 12th July, 13th September, 11th October, 8th November and 13th December.

We start the New Year with old problems as parking in the village remains a major issue in a number of areas. One particular area is the Inn on the Green crossroads where it is often difficult to turn into Church Street because of cars parked right on the junction. Please could I remind villagers that parking within 10 metres of a junction is illegal and ask that everyone considers where they park and how it could affect others? May I also ask that people don't park directly on the cobbled areas?

The Parish Council is aware that parking is one of the main areas of concern within the village and is always keen to hear from parishioners who have any ideas which could help us. As you will know from Andrew's article in the previous edition of *Parish News*, we are looking at a shared car scheme. We would love to hear your views on this or maybe you have the expertise to help us look into this project? Please do get in touch. Thank you.

Summary of Draft Minutes December 2021

- 1. Minutes of the November meeting agreed as correct.
- 2. Matters Arising: it was decided to investigate the cost of repair of the 'cemetery bench', with a view to restoration and relocation.
- 3. Public Participation

Parish Cllrs: The Chair thanked those responsible for setting up the Christmas tree on the Green.

The Chair reported there had been no recent applications to the Project Fund. AN to write an article in *Parish News* promoting the fund.

Parishioners: Concern about potholes in Cuffer Lane – Chair to contact Highways.

Concern about potholes in Play Park area car park – AB to contact Phil Anderson.

Concern over parking on pavements – Chair to write an article in *Parish News* highlighting the issue.

Community Car Scheme is going well. A volunteer to cover Gerry Walsh's absence has been recruited. GW to meet the Parish Clerk to review paperwork and grant application.

4. Financial Matters

Financial report to 30th November was noted.

Payments for December were approved.

Draft Budget 2022/3, including the parish precept, were considered and approved.

5. Planning

Applications received:

a) Erection of an agricultural building in Cuffer Lane: Mr Whaley's application was discussed and the Clerk will lodge PC's objection to Breckland Council.

b) Single Storey side extension, The Haven, Rosemary Lane: No objection.

c) Rear ground- and first-floor extension, porch canopy to front door, replacement single- to double-glazed windows, 8 Chapel Street: No objection.

6. BT Digital Voice

Concern was expressed regarding this latest BT proposal, as in the absence of mobile a phone signal, it would leave us with no telecommunications in the village during a power cut. Chair to send our concerns to BT.

7. Community Involvement Consultation

Breckland has invited comments on the new Local Plan. The document was discussed and AB to reply on behalf of the PC.

8. Neighbourhood Plan

MM stated our NP was at the Examination Stage.

9. Amenities

a) Grounds Maintenance: AB to find out if the additional work on the trees at the rear of the allotments had been carried out to allow the letting of the affected plot.

b) Closed Churchyard: MM and AB to plan a way forward for 2022 regarding the wildflower area.

c) Cemetery: memorial request for the late Betty Anderson approved. MD and AN had checked the Burial Register with the plan of the new part of the cemetery in order to ascertain the number of available plots. The reserved plots were noted and it was agreed to have the vacant plots rodded at a cost of approximately £280.00.

d) Allotments: available plots to be offered to those on the waiting list.

e) Play Area: DC reported that replacement posts had been installed and that the Bee Maze had been delivered and he would arrange installation.

f) Public Footpaths: walking and checking of Path 6 will take place in January. Thanks were expressed to Barbara Cattermole who had arranged repairs to the broken bridge on Path 5.

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
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
