

David Hupton's Village Years

David came to New Buckenham with Carolyn and their children, Katie and Ellie, 31 years ago, which means that David spent half his life living here. David had many friends, spending hours with them through shared interests and activities, not least eating, drinking, walking, traveling and putting both the world to rights and, of course, Norwich City F.C.

David loved living in the village and made many significant contributions to village life. He was not content just to participate in activities and events, but was most frequently an active contributor, supporting many of them behind the scenes. Over the years there were few events where David and Carolyn have not been involved, in one way or another.

David was always willing to put his range of skills and interests to good use in helping to set up, support and engage in a wide range of village activities. In the early years he took up bell-ringing and joined the village badminton club. He regularly assisted in the running of the senior youth club and fund-raising for the Junior Activities Committee. You would always find him on the gate on the night of the fireworks display, having already helped with the set-up in the morning.

In more recent years, he joined the bridge club and he jointly edited the *Parish News*; he was one of the founding members of NewBArts. He also played a major role in putting together the brochure for the Annual Art Exhibition. David was not a committee man, never seeking the limelight, preferring to work behind the scenes. For example, although not a formal member of the 'fundraisers', he was always a very active participant in the organisation of the Village Fete. He also took up running and was a familiar sight running through the village.

When Ellie became a leading light in the New Buckenham Players, David applied his skills in design to making a special contribution to set design and building. He took a minimalist approach to art and design and while the crew built wonderful sets they were often made up of large and heavy structures. David would introduce positive suggestions that were the exact opposite, and certainly much easier to get on and off stage! One of David's greatest triumphs was to construct, with the help of Lindsey Hodges, a life size articulated model of the lion Aslan for the production of *The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe*. It was so lifelike, with head made by Sarah Nash, that when it first appeared it got a spontaneous round of applause.

David was always keen to support local businesses. For example he felt strongly that the village pubs were an essential part of village life and while being no more than a social drinker, when the future of the village pubs was under threat several years ago, David and Carolyn dedicated themselves to making regular use of both pubs for drinks and meals and encouraged others to join them. So you can see the kind of sacrifices David and Carolyn were prepared to make to support this community!

David will be sorely missed by his family and also by his friends and fellow villagers. When we plan for the next fete, prepare for the next art exhibition, begin building the next set, when we need another person for our quiz team or we need some wise words or a good chuckle over a pithy comment we will think of him. David was a great friend, loyal and generous and a great contributor to our community.

New Buckenham Climate Action Now The Story So Far!

Since our climate action group formed in 2019, we have tried to identify small, achievable goals which will help to make our beautiful village a more carbon-neutral and ecologically diverse place to live. We began with planting a symbolic oak tree on the village green. Many of you brought your children along to support us and to help with the planting. The following year, we invited people to apply to adopt and plant trees on approved sites around the village. Thanks to funding from the Parish Council and invaluable advice from Phil Anderson, we were able to purchase twelve healthy native trees which were planted by their successful adopters and are now flourishing around the village. One adopter deserves a special mention: not only does Andrea Halfacree regularly bring the young children she minds to carefully water 'their' tree, a Holme oak, but the children also sing to it and sometimes decorate it, forming a connection with the natural world which they will surely remember all their lives.

Last autumn, some of you will have noticed the gradual transformation of the murky old Ghost Pond close to the cricket pavilion. The Norfolk Wildlife Trust, together with local volunteers, spent several days removing rubbish and clearing the willows and brambles which were blocking out light and air, revealing a surprisingly large space – large but worryingly dry at first! However our wet winter took care of that and at the time of writing this once neglected, almost-hidden pond is now an airy, clean pool where courting ducks can now be seen swimming.

Now that Spring is here at last, we are mulling ideas and strategies for future projects and directions. For instance, we are hoping to link up with other similar groups to share our experiences and information.

By the end of this year, we want to plant more trees, including one in memory of Violet Highton, without whom this group might not exist. We already have a growing list of people who would like to adopt a tree. However, we first need to identify suitable sites. One plan is to approach the Village Hall Trust to ask if we might be able to plant trees around the amphitheatre. Also, since we have money in the kitty from last year's successful Great Big Green Afternoon, we'd like to use some of this to buy butterfly and bee boxes, involving young families in decorating and putting up the boxes around the village to help encourage pollinators. We'd also like to let everyone know, well ahead of time, that this autumn we will be screening the family-friendly film My Octopus Teacher in the Village Hall, an event which sadly had to be cancelled last year.

Finally, I want to mention Sue and Kim, active members of New Buckenham CAN, who recently attended an online course run by PLANTLIFE on ways we can all help to help make our gardens, allotments and other outdoor spaces more attractive to wildlife, particularly the increasingly endangered pollinators. Next month we will be sharing some of what they learned with you.

Please, Please, Please!

New Buckenham is a lovely village, a much sought after place to live in and a popular place to visit. There are plenty of places to have a walk and a mardle and, for our youngsters, a lovely play area, opportunities to play sport or simply run free, enjoy the fresh air and have fun.

Unfortunately these delights of New Buckenham are being ruined by a huge increase in the amount of dog excrement which is scattered around the village and its outskirts. Dog excrement is the most unacceptable and offensive type of litter. It is deeply unpleasant and it is dangerous. Contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis – a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizures.

It is clear that the majority of dog owners are caring, responsible individuals who clean up after their dogs, so we are appealing to those who don't do so. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag does not count as a reasonable excuse. There are five dog excrement bins in the village – please contact the Parish Council if you feel there is an appropriate site for another one.

Please, please clean up after your dogs and allow everyone to enjoy our delightful village.

Chair's Report 2021-22

The Chair welcomed Steve Askew (Breckland and Norfolk County Councillor) and three members of the public.

She talked about comings and goings – Andrew Nettleton had joined the Council in April 2021, co-opted to replace Paul Martin. In November 2021, we said goodbye to our clerk, Trevor Wenman, and welcomed Angela Thornton as our new clerk.

The Chair spoke about the many responsibilities which councillors take on in addition to the monthly meetings and

actions arising from them, as outlined below:

Allotments - Mary Manning and Andrew Nettleton

Cemetery - Andrew Nettleton

Community Project Fund – Mary Dowson, Andrew Nettleton and the Chair

Footpaths - Andrew Bingham and Steve Highton

Parish News - Mary Dowson

Play Area – Don Crossman

The Parish Council also has representatives on the Village Hall Trust, the Neighbourhood Plan group, the High Bailiff's Trust and the William Barber Trust.

The Chair talked about the main issues which had arisen over the year, namely parking, speeding and the problem of dog excrement. The council is always trying to deal with these problems, but would welcome suggestions from parishioners. Andrew Bingham would be talking about a village electric car and charging point later in the meeting. The council is also looking at gateways at the entrances to the village in order to slow drivers down.

There have been some successes over the year:

A new sensory Bee Maze at the Play Area

A number of new tenants at the allotments

Marsh Lane has been re-surfaced

Work has started on the phone mast

BT's Digital Voice scheme has been postponed

We have received a plaque from the Lord Lieutenant of Norfolk to commemorate the village's resilience during the pandemic

Our Community Grant Scheme has supported the Village Hall Trust with a grant towards the purchase of a new boiler and New Buckenham Junior Football Club with the purchase of a set of goals.

Councillors have attended a number of NALC courses

We are working with the Parochial Church Council to look at issues highlighted in the recent Quinquennial Report. The Parish Council will repair the steps and handrail near the south door and review the management of the conservation area in the churchyard.

Barbara Cattermole for her work on footpaths, especially organising the bridge repairs on Footpath 4

Steve Askew, our Breckland and Norfolk County Councillor, for all his support

Gerry Walsh for her work on the Community Car Scheme.

Clive Rush who has volunteered to restore the 'Cemetery Bench'

Sue Britton who is currently working on a defibrillator project

Phil Anderson for his sterling work on grounds maintenance in the cemetery, the play area, the cricket pitch and the churchyard and various other projects around the village.

Vicky and Alan Baker for their work in the churchyard.

Stevie Hobley who minuted last month's meeting and Juliet Fulford for minuting the evening's two meetings.

The Chair concluded the meeting by thanking her fellow councillors for their commitment to New Buckenham Parish Council over the previous 12 months.
