It was Ginny with her magnificent waggy tail who received the first of the New Buckenham dog show rosettes.

The classes ended with 'Most Royal Dog'. We had the excitement of seeing what Jimpy and Louise had hidden in their bag for Monty. Out came the most impressive outfit, complete with crown, cloak and a special royal blanket. The top prize was, however, awarded to the lovely spaniel Harry, accompanied by Lottie and Sam. A big thank you also to Trisha Sherston and Sue Bose for their judging of this event.

In the next ring, the dogs were lining up to take part in the agility course. There were whoops of delight from the audience as dog owners took to jumping the jumps and crawling through the tunnel in an attempt to show their dogs what to do! Their dogs looked on amazed at what their owners could achieve in such a short time and with very little training. Our overall winner with the fastest time and worthy of a round at Crufts was Arlo.

The sound of the church bells (thank you to Alice and Barbara Cattermole) rang out to announce the start of the Jubilee Lunch. A big thank you to everyone who came to set out the tables and chairs. Also to Dan and Rob who spent many hours putting up the fairy lights in the hall. The village hall looked beautiful and was soon full of the most incredible buffet of sweet and savoury treats. Sadly, the wind decided to blow away the table decorations, but this didn't stop everyone having a fantastic time.

Parish Council meetings take place on the second Tuesday of every month with the exception of August when we don't usually meet. Remaining dates for 2022 are 13th September; 11th October; 8th November and 13th December.

### **1. Minutes**

Minutes of the May meeting confirmed as correct.

### **2. Matters Arising**

Steve Askew has reported that work in Marsh Lane is complete, MM to contact him regarding 'bollard' issues still remaining.

Moat Lane, Byway Open to all Traffic (BOAT) and Village Gateway issues to be carried forward to the next meeting.

Website issues with Android devices: AT brought her device to the meeting and had no problem with access.

Defibrillator: the landlord at the King's Head has agreed it can be located on the front wall of the public house. Council agreed to purchase the most suitable defibrillator. Action KH.

### **3. Public Participation**

Parish Councillors' Reports

The Chair and all Cllrs expressed huge thanks to Mandy, her team and all other volunteers for facilitating the wonderful Jubilee celebrations in the village. AT to write a letter of thanks.

MM raised the issue of the toddler playground gate not closing properly. Action DC.

### **4. Financial Matters**

The financial report for May was approved.

Council agreed a £200 donation to ATT Care.

Payments for June were approved.

Annual Internal Audit Report 2021/2022 approved.

Annual Governance Statement 2021/2022 approved.

Accounting Statements in the 2021/2022 in the Annual Return approved.

Annual Return approved and signed.

The Accounts were considered, the seemingly high income is related to two years' VAT claims; approved.

## **5. Planning**

Tudor Rose Cottage, King Street: Demolition garage/store, single-storey kitchen extension and porch, provision of first-floor WC. No objection, as long as plan will not reduce access or two car-parking spaces. Action AT.

Tree works at Almshouses and telephone box: no objection.

Cobwebs, Boosey's Walk: replacement front door. No objection.

Ham House, Boosey's Walk: New single-storey extension to rear, conversion of linked garage to bedroom and shower room and replacement of UPVC windows. No objection.

## **6. Amenities**

Grounds maintenance: AT to ensure future accounting records break down costs across different areas maintained.

Closed Churchyard: AB has obtained a quotation for the handrail and steps which will be submitted to the Diocese.

Cemetery: AN to arrange rodding of the 'old' cemetery. AT to prepare a review of costings.

Allotments: currently plot 14 is available. AT to prepare a review of costings.

Play Area: DC to get quotation for a see-saw. AT to prepare a

review of costings of the Cricket Pitch.

Public Footpaths: Barbara Cattermole has offered a familiarisation of village footpaths in September or October.

## **7. Neighbourhood Plan.**

MM reported that the referendum will take place at the Village Hall on 7th July run by Breckland Council. This is the culmination of four years' work. The Neighbourhood Plan Working Group will commence an awareness campaign on June 28th: Facebook, Parish News and leaflets will be utilised.

## **8. Any Other Business**

Succession Planning referred to the next meeting because not all councillors were present.

Green issues not discussed because no one from CAN attended.

**DIETARY NOTES:** Our communion wine is now non-alcoholic, and we can supply gluten-free communion wafers if you let us know.

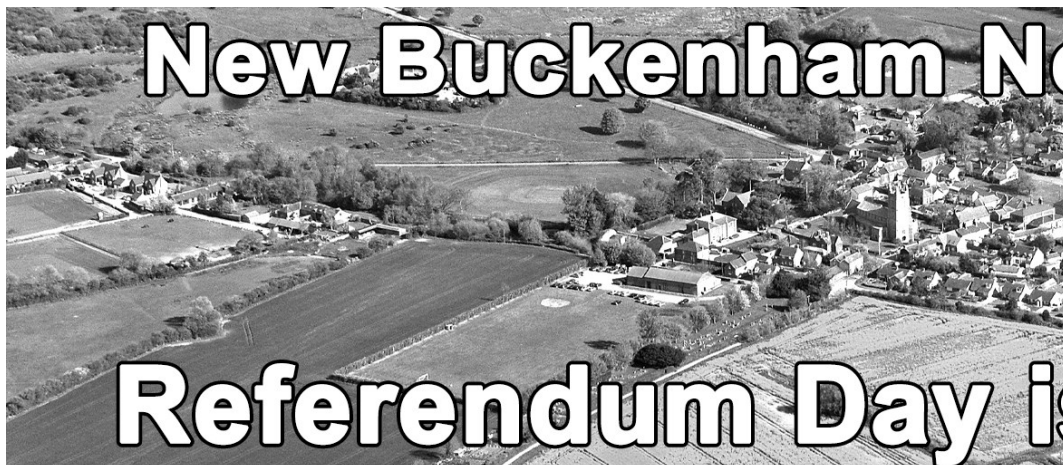

Yes - please vote on Referendum Day! It's your chance to have your say in the future of the village.

You will be asked one question: Do you want Breckland Council to use New Buckenham's Neighbourhood Plan to help it decide planning applications in our Neighbourhood Plan area?

## **What happens if the Plan is accepted by Breckland?**

Our Plan then becomes part of Breckland's statutory development plan for our area and the Parish Council's policies, stated in the Plan, must be taken into account.

## **Who can vote and how?**

All New Buckenham residents on the Electoral Roll can vote. If you are not sure whether you are on the Electoral Roll, phone Breckland Council **01362 695333** or search online: **Breckland Register Vote**.

It's like a general election. The polling station at the Village Hall will be open Thursday 7 July, 7.00am - 10.00pm.

If you can't get to the Village Hall you can apply to Breckland for a postal vote.

## **When's the result?**

With luck, the result will be known the next morning.

# Open Gardens & Village Show

A big, big thank you to everyone who helped with Open Gardens. I have personally thanked all those directly involved, but I haven't thanked all those who supplied cakes. They were eaten before I could get the names of the bakers and, unfortunately, we ran out at 4pm, so next time we will have to plan better. Nevertheless, the teas and cakes made £400, which is quite amazing so thanks to all who baked.

I must also thank Lynn, Clive, Janet Trewin and Charles for donating plants to the Plant Stall, run by Charles and Pat Oxley, which made nearly £300. That also is impressive. The church was open and had some pot plants donated, which raised £38 for church funds.

As for visitors, we estimate that there were 320, plus some children. That is a lot of footfall in gardens that normally only see family and the occasional barbeque. What helped was that we were blessed with perfect weather for walking and viewing and that was commented on by many who also praised the quality and range of gardens.

We have raised about £2,000 through this event, which is more than we need to support the Village Show. When Caroline and Jo set up the Gardening Group 27 years ago their aim was also to support gardening charities or projects. When we have finalised the accounts, we will inform you of the donations that we have made.

An event like this requires a great deal of planning and organising before the day to ensure that there are no hiccups. To achieve this, I call on my two accomplices: Karen Hobley and Lynn Carter. Karen, you know as Parish Council Chairman and several other roles and Lynn is an accountant (don't hold that against her) plus numerous other skills. Massive thanks go to both of them for their efforts!

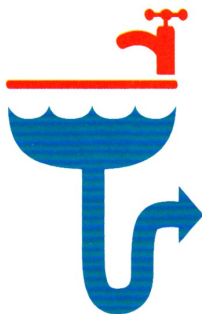

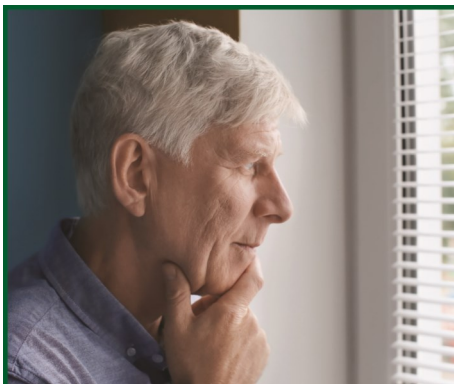
