New Buckenham Neighbourhood Plan

At the Referendum on Thursday 7 July, New Buckenham voted whether our Parish Council's Neighbourhood Plan should be used in Breckland planning decisions. The votes in favour were 170 (92% of votes cast) and the votes against were 14 (8%).

The turnout was 44% of the electorate, higher than that for other Breckland towns and villages. This showed our community's interest and support since the project was officially launched at an open day in April 2017. Many thanks to all who voted.

More than being just a planning document for Breckland, the Plan is an appraisal of New Buckenham and the way it works and thinks. It has stimulated debate on many issues and clarified Parish Council policies.

The Plan's working party wishes to thank all the many residents who helped this project come to fruition: researchers, map makers, photographers, flyer deliverers, survey volunteers and those who took part in the focus groups. More than anything, thanks must go to villagers who gave their views – a great many views – that helped develop the Plan.

We mourn the loss of Violet Highton shortly before the Plan was completed. Violet was a key instigator of the Plan who gave freely of her wisdom and experience.

Summary of Draft Minutes July 2022

Present: Karen Hobley (KH), Mary Manning (MM), Mary Dowson (MD), Andrew Nettleton (AN) and Angel Thornton (AT Clerk).

1. Minutes

- Minutes of the June meeting confirmed as correct.

2. Matters Arising

- Marsh Lane: all issues now resolved.
- Moat Lane, Byway Open to all Traffic (BOAT) and Village Gateway issues to be carried forward to the next meeting.

- Website issues with Android devices: AT thought all issues resolved but some still finding a problem with access. AT to re-investigate.

3. Public Participation

- Parish Councillor's Reports
 - The Village Gateway: KH has contacted Breckland Council and is waiting for a response.
 - KH is comparing quotations for the purchase of a defibrillator.
 - MM expressed her thanks to Steve Askew for resolving Marsh Lane issues.

4. Financial Matters

- The financial report for June and the first quarter's budget monitoring were approved.
- The 5-year Annual Electrical Inspection was approved.
- Payments for July were approved.
- Expenditure of up to £1300 was approved for the annual insurance.
- A full report from AT on the Parish Council amenities budget to be brought to the September meeting.
- The Cricket Club invoice will be issued at the increased rate of £400.

5. Planning

- Tudor Rose Cottage, King Street: demolition garage/store, single storey kitchen extension and porch, provision of first

floor WC - approved by Breckland.

- Kings Cottage, King Street: proposal of replacement of all windows - no objection.

6. Amenities

- **Grounds maintenance:** AT presented the current grounds maintenance costs across all areas to prepare specification for tendering in the Autumn.

- **Closed Churchyard:** a meeting between the PCC and the Quinquennial Working Group will hopefully take place in August so that works can commence.

- **Cemetery:** rodding of both 'old' and 'new' has taken place, this has confirmed that in the 'new' there are two vacant plots and seven reserved plots. In the 'old' there are four vacant plots, four reserved plots that are usable and three that are unusable due to the trees. These will be reallocated to vacant plots which leave in total only three vacant plots. In the 'old' there are 80 plots mostly with no means of identification over 100 years old that maybe legally reused. It was approved that these should be used to provide 60 new vacant plots. AT to investigate the requirements for this. Cemetery charges to be reviewed in September.

- **Allotments:** AT reported that two untended plots had been offered to people on the waiting list but the offers had been refused. Approved that one of them be offered to family living close to the village boundary.

- **Play Area:** AT to action annual maintenance inspection.

- **Public Footpaths:** PC would like to take up the kind offer from Barbara Cattermole to facilitate a familiarisation of village footpaths. KH to ask for dates.

7. Neighbourhood Plan

- Charles Oxley and MM reported that the referendum had taken place and that 97% of votes were in favour of adopting the Neighbourhood Plan which will now go to Breckland Council cabinet for ratification. The Plan is available on the NBPC website and KH has a few hard copies.

8. Any Other Business

- Succession Planning referred to the next meeting because not all councillors were in attendance.

- Green Issues: Mandy Hartley presented the CAN report highlighting planned activities. The PC agreed the planting of trees and summer activities for children including seed bombs and bird and bug boxes. CAN, in liaison with Andrew Bingham, will facilitate a village meeting to discuss green issues.

I think we on the organising committee had some concerns after the last couple of years that we might not have the same support from the artists, helpers and paying public – but that was not the case at all, a near record amount of entries, visitors and sales ensued!

Talking to both artists and visitors on Friday night I got a real sense that the Exhibition had been missed and it was good to get back to near “normal”, as always I was impressed with the quality and range of work entered and thought we had some really interesting exhibits.

I would like to add my thanks to everyone involved from the planning that started way back in September last year right through to the those helped over the weekend so selflessly, a great example of the New Buckenham community spirit!

After taking out the costs for the cancelled 2020 exhibition it leaves £4,067.44 which has been equally divided to the Church and Village

Hall, over the years the Art Exhibition has generated over £80,000 to these village causes – not bad at all!


