

Churchyard Conservation Area

The conservation area on the north side of the church has now had its annual cut. The long grass has been scythed and raked up and the hay removed, reducing nutrient levels in the soil. Low soil nutrient levels provide the best conditions for wildflower growth. The grass was dry which hopefully allowed grass and wildflower seeds to drop and lie dormant on the soil adding to the wildflower growth next year. With proper management the aim is that year by year the soil conditions and wildflower growth will improve.

Sue Chapman kindly carried out a survey of the wildflowers in the conservation area during July and found: Bryony, Soapwort, Lady's Bedstraw, Knapweed, Red Campion, Lords and Ladies, and a range of grasses.

The purpose of the conservation area is to develop an insect-friendly environment and ecosystem in the centre of the village that is also visually attractive with extensive wildflowers and grasses. The area is fully accessible and I encourage everyone to take the opportunity to walk around the area and enjoy it.

New Buckenham Recycling Project

Although you may only see me around the village collecting the cardboard, Keith Mace, who used to live in the village, collects metals from the village and elsewhere, takes it to Mellor Metals and the money goes straight into the NBRP account. He also collects cardboard from some out-of-village sites. So a big thank you to Keith, who was the originator of the project a few decades back and is still going strong.

Also, thank you and keep recycling! There are bottle, paper and tin banks at the Village Hall. I am around the village on a Friday, usually collecting large pieces of cardboard. If you have cardboard for me to collect please ring the number below, talk to me or leave a message.

PLEASE do not leave the cardboard out in the rain if you can help it. Wet cardboard clogs the machines that cut the cardboard up.

The cardboard I collect is stored at Mill House Garage with kind permission of Clive Rush. Every couple of weeks or so I then take it to Whites at Ketteringham where it is weighed and a weigh-bill given. This is then sent to NCC along with any other weigh-bills and monies deposited into the NBRP account.

All the work, storage, administration and transportation is given freely and no money is taken out of the project. It all goes to the good causes!

New Buck Bats Hang Up For Winter

It's almost the end of the bat season. Any minute now they'll be finding a place to hang out over the winter. Here in New Buckenham we have had yet another sensational bat-recording summer. Of the 18 species of bat in the UK, we have recorded 14 of them, including the four rarest bats in the entire country. These are on the 'red list' as designated by the 2020 International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN). They are the Barbastelle and the Serotine, both of which are categorised as 'vulnerable', and Leisler's bat and Nathusius' Pipistrelle, both categorised as 'near threatened'.

Our unique medieval village has now clocked up another unique feature. We were the only place in Norfolk to conduct that all-important Norfolk Bat Survey. It started in 2013 and we got involved in 2016, but it was suspended two years ago due to Covid. People couldn't access the equipment. However, we were determined and with the help of Batman Superior – Dr Stuart Newson, who is the brainbox behind the technology – we kept calm and carried on!

This, of all years, was significant due to the extraordinary weather conditions. Since it began, the project has analysed at least 1.9 million bat recordings across this county. We monitor two square kilometres of land in and around New Buckenham. We've covered more than 20 locations and have tens of thousands of recordings.

It's been a tough year for bats; beautifully hot, but the water sources have dried. Many species rely on places like the Spittle Mere as sources of insect life. Other species depend on trees and hedgerows, which is not much good if the vegetation is drought-ridden and the leaves dying. Numbers were dipping towards the end of the summer, but the species were still there.

All UK bats are protected by domestic and international law, although a new danger is looming large. The Bat Conservation Trust predicts that repealing all of the European legislation post-Brexit will have an important effect on bats and their habitats. The intention is to relax rules controlling pesticides, the designation of important sites including Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONBs), Sites of Special Scientific Interest (SSSIs) and greenbelt land. Other legislation intended to support farmers as custodians of wildlife will now undergo a 'rapid review'. The effect could be catastrophic.

So what's where in and around New Buckenham?

New Buckenham Central (Village Green, Church, Market Place, etc.): Barbastelle, Serotine, Leisler's bat, Daubenton's bat, whiskered bat, natterer's bat, common pipistrelle, soprano pipistrelle, brown longeared bat, Brandt's bat, and Noctule.

New Buckenham North (Cuffer Lane, Tas Valley Way, Allotments, football pitches, etc.): Barbastelle, Serotine, Nathusius pipistrelle, Leisler's bat, Brandt's bat, Daubenton's bat, common pipistrelle, soprano pipistrelle, natterer's bat, noctule, whiskered bat, brown long -eared bat, Alcathoe bat, and Lesser horseshoe bat.

New Buckenham South (Marsh Lane, Dam Brigg area): Barbastelle, Serotine, Leisler's bat, Daubenton's bat, Natterer's bat, Noctule, Common pipistrelle, Soprano pipistrelle, Brown long-eared bat, Whiskered bat, and Brandt's bat.

New Buckenham West (Castle, Chapel St and environs, Green Point): Barbastelle, Serotine, Leisler's bat, Nathusius' pipistrelle, Noctule, Common pipistrelle, Soprano pipistrelle, Brown long-eared bat, Daubenton's bat, Brandt's bat, Whiskered bat, and Natterer's bat.

New Buckenham East (SSSI, Common, Cricket Pitch, etc.): Barbastelle, Serotine, Leisler's bat, Nathusius' pipistrelle, Noctule, Common pipistrelle, Soprano pipistrelle, Brown long-eared bat, Daubenton's bat, Brandt's bat, and Whiskered bat.

Summary of Draft Minutes October 2022

Present: Karen Hobley (KH), Andrew Bingham (AB), Don Crossman (DC), Steve Highton (SH), Andrew Nettleton (AN), Mary Manning (MM) and Mary Dowson (MD). Angela Thornton (AT Clerk).

1. Minutes

Minutes of the July meeting confirmed as correct.

2. Matters Arising

- a) BOAT (Byway Open To All Traffic): AB summarised the need to investigate the option of a BOAT from Moat Lane across the rear of the Common to mitigate the risk of access being closed. AB to make enquiries with BDC.
- b) Council website: Access via some Android tablets still a problem. AT to investigate.
- c) Village Gateway: KH awaiting response from BDC. AB to produce draft plan.
- d) Defibrillator: KH has sourced a suitable model, this will be circulated to Council members for comment. Sue Britton to bring a plan for maintenance and names of volunteers to the next meeting.

3. Public Participation

Craig Larter (CL) from County Broadband gave an update on progress. Current cabling works due for completion by the end of December. Customer connections to go live about 12 weeks later.

KH requested residents and shops were informed of works and road closures. CL apologised if this hadn't always happened and would ensure their new 'build partners' would do so.

AB raised the issue of overhead cables. CL explained that generally CB use existing Open Reach equipment.

CL clarified that an expression of interest is not a contract, but a pre-order is different and a package applied for online constitutes an electronic signature. Customer Service will clarify with individuals.

AB requested legible maps of work taking place. CL will send plans.

CL requested that the landowner of Tanning Lane be identified so that a wayleave agreement can be sought.

CL outlined the CB charity which has funds available for community projects. KH to consider applying for the defibrillator.

4. Parish Cllr Reports

KH had met the Police regarding traffic and parking problems. The officer highlighted that the SNAP meeting to set priorities is on 25th October in Attleborough Town Hall and is the forum to highlight issues.

KH clarified no Project Fund applications had been received and suggested that applications should be considered when they are received and not quarterly. AN to adapt Project Fund paperwork.

5. Parishioners Comments and Questions.

- a) Could a Neighbourhood Speed Watch be set up? KH to investigate.
- b) CAN updated on Wildlife Day. Subject to Village Hall
 Trust approval a tree will be planted to commemorate
 the Queen. A quote for tree and plaque to be considered
 at next meeting. It was agreed that a tree to

commemorate Violet Highton should be planted amongst trees near the playground.

6. Financial Matters

- a) Second quarter's budget monitoring accepted with agreement for change in next year's budget.
- b) October payments approved.
- c) Cemetery, allotments and cricket pitch costings report were discussed.

It was agreed to increase allotment charges from £30 to £40 p.a. The shortfall for 2021-22 was £1,252. AT to amend paperwork.

Meeting to be arranged with the Cricket Club to agree an increase in 2023-24. The shortfall for 2021-22 was £1,022.

Cemetery costs to increase, memorial headstone £82 to £100, exclusive rights £136 to £250, interment from £136 to £250. No more reservations will be taken until further notice. The shortfall for 2021-22 was £1,523. AT to amend paperwork.

d) PC will continue to use the external auditors appointed by SAAA.

7. Planning

- a) Approved: Ham House, Boosey's Walk.
- b) St Mary's Chapel Castle Hill Road: conversion of outbuilding to provide additional bedroom and new flat-roof kitchen-link between the outbuilding and Victorian chapel extension. No objection.
- c) Council noted that the Cuffer Lane planning application has been deferred again.

8. Amenities

a) Grounds maintenance

AT to circulate draft maintenance requirements specification for comment at the next meeting.

b) Closed Churchyard

Steps and rails to be refurbished, works approved by PCC. Village volunteers to clear and weed 'compost area'. Skip hire approved. KH to contact White House regarding the possibility of acquiring a brown bin.

Wildflower area has been cut and cleared. AT to ensure maintenance contract clarifies requirements for this area.

Deterioration of flint wall inspected by AB following correspondence from a villager. AT to send information to agent and tenant.

c) Cemetery

AT is investigating the reuse of some grave space and is waiting for information from the Diocese.

d) Allotments

Still two available plots. Agreed to offer to a family who live on the village boundary.

e) Play Area

Inspection has taken place, works required to be collated and quotes obtained.

f) Cricket Club

Secretary of the CC requested that general play and cricket areas should not allow dogs. Discussed, but not agreed.

g) Public Footpaths

PC thank Barbara Cattermole for her offer to facilitate a

village footpath walk. This will take place as part of the Hair of the Dog walk on New Year's Day. To be publicised in *Parish News*.

9. Community Car Scheme

Replacement coordinator requested, no interest to date. Reduced usage during this Summer. Gerry Walsh to submit mileage/expenses.

10. Neighbourhood Plan

Discussed implementation of NP. MM agreed to coordinate the monitoring role of checking planning applications and provide quarterly reports.

11. Succession Planning

Elections due in 2023. KH will stand down as Chair in 2024. Discussion took place regarding how long a future Chair should stand. Some ideas but no decisions made.
