

Fifty Years Ago

In March 1973 Parish News reported that a meeting had taken place to discuss the provision of toilets at the (old) Village Hall, hoping that it could be done by voluntary labour. The work was done that same year.

The meeting was then thrown open to the public to “*air their views, grievances and suggestions many of which will be considered by the Parish Council*”. Items discussed included fouling of pavements by dogs, street lighting, loose drain tops, repair of paths, condition of the cemetery and the speed limit.

Eastern Angles Make Medieval Plays Modern This Spring

After 40 years of touring theatre across the East of England, this spring Eastern Angles is reigniting the region's buzzing 15th-century theatre scene with 'Medieval Miracles'. This double bill of one-act plays promises to bring double the devils, double the tricks, and double the fun to venues across East Anglia this spring.

"East Anglia was the Broadway or West End of 15th-century English theatre" once said a stage historian, and Eastern Angles have picked two of its biggest hits to stand centre stage in their 2023 spring tour.

Speaking about the show, co-writer and director Ivan Cutting said:

"This was popular theatre at its best when people watched and laughed at sometimes quite shocking tales of contemporary scandal and daring new versions of traditional biblical myths".

First up, 'The Trails of Mary & Joseph', it's the Nativity story but not as you know it. And then there's 'Mankind', the country's most popular comedy of the 1490s, retold as a boisterous story of a climate conscious young man tempted by three mischievous devils to leave his allotment and behave very badly. With live music, comic twists and a sense of ridiculous, Eastern Angles bring two very old plays right up to date.

'Medieval Miracles' is at New Buckenham Village Hall Wednesday 29th March at 7:30pm. Doors open at 7pm and there will be a bar and refreshments. Please feel free to dress in period costume!

Who owned your house in the past?

The late Paul Rutledge, archivist and village resident, started looking into the history of New Buckenham soon after he and his wife Elizabeth moved here in 1971. In the course of so doing, he came across the landgable rental for 1634 in a High Bailiff's account book for the village. 'Landgable' was a small rent payable from nearly every property in the town.

Paul realised that by using his local knowledge of the village's layout he could possibly work out the route taken around the houses by the assessors and collectors. This would mean he would have a framework on which to hang all the other information available. He achieved this by cross-referencing with sources such as the court books, deeds and wills he found in the county archives.

Paul's painstaking detective work has achieved a history of nearly 90 New Buckenham properties. Is your house among them? Not only can you read about the residents, tenants and property transactions, but a rich account of human life is also recorded: who was licensed to eat flesh during Lent? Who had not carried away muck and earth that came out of his shops? Who was accused of keeping a house of lust, cherishing suspect persons, and allowing eating and drinking during divine service? And was that in your house?


