

New Buckenham Parish Council

At the start of a new term of office for the Parish Council, I thought it might be useful to outline the work and workings of the Parish Council. The recent election was an 'Uncontested Election', as were the majority of elections in Breckland, as we had six candidates for seven vacancies. Councillors' names and contact details are published elsewhere in this edition of *Parish News*, as are details of the process to co-opt a seventh councillor. Please contact me if you would like further information about this process. The closing date for applications is 12th June.

Now, to the work and workings: The Parish Council meets on the second Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm at the Village Hall (please note that we generally don't meet in August). A calendar of meetings is regularly published. All meetings are open to the public and there is a Public Participation period for people to bring along their ideas and express their views. I write updates in Parish News every month and there is a précis of the minutes of the previous meeting in each edition. We have a website newbuckenhampc.info, which has recently been redesigned and is regularly updated. We also have information on our notice board on the Village Green. In addition to our regular meetings, we have our Annual Parish Meeting in April. This gives our parishioners an opportunity to hear reports about the work done by the Parish Council over the previous year and has a public forum for debate. Sadly, even with the promise of drinks and nibbles, only two people attended this year! As a Parish Council, we feel that we are extremely accessible and hope that you would be happy to contact any one of us with questions or issues.

Although I personally am not on Facebook, I know that there have been comments regarding issues raised by the recent car accident on King Street. Suggestions have been made about child-shaped bollards, which we will definitely look into, although the final decision would be taken by Norfolk County Council's Highways department and not the Parish Council. Speed-limit stickers for wheelie bins have also been suggested and are another excellent idea. As the roads of New Buckenham become ever more congested, one person suggested that we ask those who have driveways to be kind enough to park their cars off the road. As ever, we also ask that people park with due consideration to others and avoid parking near junctions, particularly the Church Street / Chapel Street junction which is becoming ever more dangerous. Susan Felton has set up a Speed Watch team who will soon be receiving their training and will be active in the village. You can read about this elsewhere in *Parish News*. Thanks to Sue and her group of volunteers.

Speeding and parking are regularly discussed at our meetings and our minutes provide a paper trail of actions which we have looked at. From comments on Facebook, a number of people will be attending our next meeting. We will be delighted to see you and hear your ideas and views. Thank you.

I'll finish with a reminder that our next Parish Council meeting is on 13th June at 7:30pm at the Village Hall and a warm welcome is, as ever, extended to all parishioners.

Community Speedwatch

A great many of us are concerned about the speeding in our lovely village and we are in the process of setting up a Community Speedwatch group to try and do something about it. Driving at excessive speeds through our winding, occupied roads is a very real danger to families and pets, as well as our parked cars, and the recent accident on Kings Street could have resulted in more than a demolished bollard and badly damaged pavement. Primarily we want to ensure that everybody is safe walking around the village and our children are safe playing. But, added to this, we want the relaxed, pleasant environment I suspect many of us opted for when choosing to live in this historical village far from city life. We also want our buildings and homes preserved and reduced noise pollution; 'Two-wheel Tuesday' comes to mind!

We have seen a marked increase in traffic with the ongoing works on the A11 and hopefully this will decrease with time, but if it doesn't, we need to have solutions for the 'rat-running' traffic. We need to get all motorists to respect the 20 miles-per-hour speed limit from start to finish and, for clarity, the police have confirmed that this speed limit will be enforced. I urge all members of our community to drive at, or below 20 miles per hour as this, in itself, will slow the traffic passing through the village. Please also put up stickers, speak to visitors, delivery drivers, etc., and if you'd like to help further, please do get in touch. We have both the support of the police and the Parish Council to attack this challenging and persistent problem and please support us when you see us in the village.

Re-greening of Market Place

Decimated by last year's drought and mowing regime, leaving it brown, dead and barren for months, both sides of Market Place are now recovering.

Towards the end of last summer, there was evidence of the hardiness of wild flowers in the extreme conditions, as individual flowers and little patches of others began to emerge.

This spring, following cooler temperatures and much needed rain, the green is back! But, all is not quite as it was. Instead of grass, in some places there are large patches of wild creeping geranium with its tiny pink flowers and flat green leaves. This must have lain dormant for many years waiting for the right conditions for it to burst into life. So, we now have a pink green!

Another hugely positive asset for Market Place is Phil Anderson who has the contract for cutting the grass. Phil has now done this three times, setting the parameters for regular cuts throughout the year. The last cut is usually around September.

With Phil's knowledge, understanding and sensitivity, these cuts are already paying dividends. The longer, stronger grass has been trimmed giving the right conditions for the wild flowers to come through. This has had an immediate effect on the number and variety of bees and other pollinators feeding on them. In turn, the birds are now more in evidence on the ground, feeding on the bugs attracted to the wild flowers. Alongside the starlings and blackbirds, a pair of goldfinches has also been seen.

The High Bailiffs Trust's management of Market Place has not always been easy with conflict between keeping the status quo of tidy yet unproductive grass, or supporting biodiversity. However, by allowing a small, tucked away area next to Wisteria House to remain wild, but managed, a sensitive and meaningful compromise has been reached.

Not only is our village unique in its layout and built history, the natural resources around us provide a rich and varied biodiversity.

The common, a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) is owned and cared for by the Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT).

With increasing awareness of the importance of leaving even small areas wild, such as the churchyard, verges and an area on the playing field, our capacity for improving our biodiverse footprint is growing. Each of these areas around the village build an important link which creates a highway for the bees and other bugs. Each of these areas also has particular conditions supporting the flowers which grow on them. Thus, the green-winged orchids do not grow elsewhere. In return, the common does not support the variety of wild flowers seen in and around the village.

Underneath the lime trees on the south side of Market Place is particularly rich. There is a minimum of twenty-five different flower varieties as well as several types of grass.

Apart from the lime trees which were planted possibly 160 years ago, this piece of ground has never been cultivated. Helen Baczkowska, from the NWT, says this is likely to be a rare area of ancient grassland dating back to medieval times. This means it has lain virtually untouched for centuries.

Parts of this small area have moss growing in the shadier patches. This helps to retain moisture which is probably why two frogs had made it their home a couple of years ago. Leaving the grass a little longer in this space is also important in cutting down evaporation so keeping a degree of dampness in the ground.

The wonderful children's garden project set up by Mandy Hartley shows what we can do for wildlife in our gardens.

The exciting prospect of a community woodland, as well as the new trees planted three years ago add yet another level of support from the village towards combating climate change.

With all that we are doing towards protecting and promoting wildlife, New Buckenham has the opportunity of becoming a pioneering flagship village, with tourists and visitors inspired to take some of our ideas back to their own communities.
