Chapel Street Pump

If you have driven or walked down Chapel Street in the last few days you will have noticed that the old village pump has been replaced with a spanking new green one. We, the High Bailiffs Trust, are responsible for the pump and when the old one finally collapsed



we realised that we had to do something other than cap the well and turn it into a car parking space. Fortunately, our latest recruit, Don Crossman, took on the project and we can all see the result.

There used to be two public village pumps for those who did not have their own wells dug and pumps fitted. One disappeared when the bus stop was installed on the village green but the one in Chapel Street remained. However, back in the 1960s, Dr Hamerton locked it up as the water was judged to be unsafe. Since then the pump fell into disrepair and finally gave up the ghost some time ago.

Steve Highton measured the well and found it to be 9 metres deep with 5 metres of water and if you were worried about the well itself, the brickwork still appears to be in good order. So we went ahead with a replacement.

Don enlisted the help of Phil Anderson who assisted with the installation of the four new posts and Gary Buckle with the replacement of the old concrete collar with a slab to which the pump is now bolted.

The pump itself was purchased from Panks engineers in Norwich who also installed it and got it working. Admittedly they did charge for their input, but they brought pump expertise to the installation and quickly got it working. We are very grateful that neither Phil nor Gary charged for the hours, the materials and equipment they donated to the project. A special thanks to them.

It is great that with all this assistance, we were able to restore a village monument and more importantly, to get our picture in the EDP (thanks Sonya).

A word of warning, we have not had it tested yet so please do not drink the water. However, it is probably excellent for your plants.

News from the Pews

Farewell: The Rev Bob Baker led a moving funeral last month for Mrs Joan Whitwham, who died at the age of 100 years and 10 months. She came to the village in 1959, with her husband, Rev Hugh Whitwham, and their daughters Fizzy and Chrissie. Those were the days The Old Vicarage was just The Vicarage, and the resident priest had just one church to look after. Hugh was the last vicar of New Buckenham, which joined the Quidenham group after his death in 1977, so this really was the end of an era in the history of our parish, and it was good to give thanks for the work that both Joan and Hugh did here.

Coffeemates!: Huge thanks again for yet another record breaking coffee morning last month. We raised £244.80 for YANA – a charity which supports the wellbeing of those who work in agriculture and rural businesses – and collected lots of tins and packets for our Harvest display and ultimately the Food Bank. That's the last one until spring, so thank you to all the helpers, bakers, stall holders, raffle contributors, cleaners, washer uppers and above all our loyal supporters. You have raised the astonishing total of £1,141.38 this year for various charities – thank you all very much. See you in April!

Service Rota: Slight changes this month. We have the usual group service on the first Sunday of the month, at Eccles this time, but there will be no evensong on the second Sunday, as we are marking Remembrance Sunday in the morning. We are delighted to welcome Rev Canon Tony Billett for Holy Communion here on 19th November and we have Morning Worship with coffee here on 26th.

Diary Dates: Beyond there, everything changes as we approach Christmas! We have Christingle on 3rd December, Readings and Carols on 10th December, Midnight Mass on Christmas Eve, and the Crib Service on Christmas morning. All welcome!

Choir: The choir goes from strength the strength as our singing at Harvest proved. We are now getting ready for Christmas and would welcome more voices even just for this season. Organ Fund: Having just spent £900 on urgent repairs, we have had to call out the specialists again to tweak the blower and our valiant organists Peter, Sarah and Grant have coped with its bronchial noises, for which we are very grateful! We are investigating grants to pay for the remainder of the £16,100 which it will cost to fully repair this wonderful instrument. Sadly, George Burrows our resident organist has had to retire due to ill health and will be much missed. We will be thanking George for his considerable service over the years because we cannot let him retire quietly!

Reredos: The ornamental wooden screen behind the altar is being gilded, kindly funded by the Pearson family, in memory of Helen Pearson. Helen did so much for the church, and this will be a fitting memorial. It will take a little time to do, so you may see Fiona hard at work if you go into the church.

The Poppy

The pale lilac opium poppy, orange poppy and more widely seen red poppy all grow wild around New Buckenham. The opium poppy flower and its plant is much larger than the red and orange varieties. The Latin name, *Papaver Somniferum*, means the 'sleep bringing poppy'. It has been used as a drug since 3400 BC when it was known as 'the joy plant'. *Papaver Somniferum* has been grown commercially in the UK since 2002. In 2014, 6300 acres across Dorset, Lincolnshire, Oxfordshire and Hampshire were grown for the pharmaceutical market. It is only the seed pod and 2" of the stem which are used to produce pain relieving drugs such as codeine and morphine. The seeds, which contain no morphine, are cleaned for culinary use.

The common red poppy holds a poignant place in the minds of many owing to its association with conflict and remembrance. Flowering from June to August, there are still a few holding on in mid-October.

During the First World War the countryside of Western Europe was repeatedly churned up and turned to mud during the fighting where little or nothing could grow. The exception was the bright red 'Flanders' poppy. With the churning up of the ground, where the seeds may have lain dormant for many years, the poppy flourished in these extraordinary conditions, growing in their thousands.

John McCrae, a Canadian Lt. Col. and doctor during WWI, lost a close friend at Ypres. The moving sight of so many bright red poppies amid so much destruction inspired him to write 'In Flanders Field':

In Flanders field the poppies blow

Between the crosses, row on row,

That mark our place; and in the sky

The larks, still bravely singing, fly

Scarce heard amid the guns below.

We are the Dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie,
In Flanders fields.

Take up our quarrel with the foe:

To you from failing hands we throw

The torch; be yours to hold it high.

If ye break faith with us who die

We shall not sleep, though poppies grow

In Flanders fields

An American academic, Moina Michael, having read and been moved by the poem, campaigned to have it adopted as an official symbol of remembrance across America. She worked with other campaigners in Canada, Australia and the UK who wanted to do the same.

A French woman, Anna Guerain, was in London in 1921. At this time, Earl Haig was forming the Royal British Legion. He was persuaded to adopt the poppy as the UK emblem. Earl Haig ordered nine million poppies which were sold on 11th November that year. The money raised was used to help war veterans with housing and jobs. Wanting to make sure there were enough poppies to sell for the next appeal, Major George Howson set up a poppy factory employing disabled exservicemen to make them.

To this day, the red poppy continues to be an enduring and poignant symbol of remembrance.

New Buckenham Parish Council

Our November Parish Council meeting will take place on Tuesday 14th November at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. A warm welcome is extended to all parishioners. A reminder that the agenda relevant to each meeting will be posted on the noticeboard on the Village Green and on the website (newbuckenhampc.info) where you will also find further information about the Parish Council.

Parish Council meetings take place on the second Tuesday of every month. The remaining date for 2023 is 12th December.

Very many thanks to the Speedwatch members (Sue Felton, Sue Briton and Maria Lloyd) who attended the Police SNAP meeting on 19th October. They were able to talk through their statistics and put forward an excellent case for extra support for dealing with speeding issues in New Buckenham and I was also able to feedback on behalf of the Parish Council. It was made clear that there will be further support available from the Police in the near future. The SNAP (Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel) meetings are open to all, and October's was attended by representatives from at least seven other villages, all of whom had speeding problems.

On the subject of speeding, thank you also to Andrew who has submitted an application for a grant for a Village Gateway which will be designed to slow down traffic approaching the village on the B1113 from Norwich. Andrew has completed a lot of work on this project.

At our October Parish Council meeting, issues were also brought up about overhanging branches in Rosemary Lane which impede the Flexibus and also bins which are left out for a number of days, blocking pavements which cause difficulties for people getting past, who have to step out into the road.

At both meetings, it was clear that there are things which we can do to help each other in the village so, on behalf of the Parish Council, may I request once more that you drive and park safely in our village and ensure that your actions don't cause problems for fellow villagers? Thank you.

Summary of Draft Minutes: October 2023

Present: Karen Hobley (KH) Chair, Mary Manning (MM), Paul Martin (PM), Andrew Bingham (AB), Don Crossman (DC), Stevie Hobley (SH) Minutes. Also in attendance, one parishioner.

1. Minutes of the September meeting confirmed as correct.

2. Matters Arising

- a) Village Gateway: Action AB to complete Parish Partnership application process and submit by December 2023.
- b) Defibrillator: Awaiting installation at the King's Head.
- c) County Broadband Wayleave Agreement: Still with solicitors.
- d) Establishment of community woodland: 1st choice potential site unavailable; 2nd site to be investigated. Landowner contacted. Action AB.
- e) Electric Charging Point: NCC site survey complete. Charging points to be installed and maintained by NCC. Probable location in the first two disabled bays. Replacement disabled bays to be at the rear of the Village Hall. Costs and funding to be discussed.

- f) Breckland Mobile Food Store: Information received and can be found earlier in PN.
- g) Speedwatch: A newsletter with information about speeding issues has been sent to all Village Hall users. Increased activity along Church Street to be monitored.
- h) Brew Daisy: An email from prospective leaseholders of Angel Cakes was discussed but it was felt this arrangement could continue on a Tuesday from 10am-2pm.

3. Public Participation - Parish Cllrs

- a) KH will ensure the Christmas Tree is ordered.
- b) KH has visited Old Buckenham Primary School library which has been refurbished partly with money from the Community Project Fund. She reported that the school has provided a very welcoming space for children to encourage pupils to read.
- c) MD had received a letter from a parishioner to suggest making a pathway in the car park near the Play Area to reduce the risk to children. It was felt there was not enough space and it was unlikely to stop the children running across the car park. Action AT.
- d) MM has received information that the Flexibus has difficulty in Rosemary Lane due to overhanging brambles. KH to write an article in PN regarding overhanging foliage and bins obstructing the paths.

4. Financial Matters

- a) Bank reconciliation for September approved.
- b) Payments for October approved.

5. Planning

Applications at Anvil Cottage, Castle Hill Road and 2 Town Houses, Marsh Lane were considered – no objection but requested Breckland would consider that both overlooked neighbouring properties.

6. Amenities

a) Closed Churchyard

Refurbishment of Victorian lamppost - to consider options whether it is part of the church fabric or PC responsibility. Emails to be forwarded to Cllrs for a decision next meeting.

b) Cemetery

Registration on the Diocesan system is in place to allow re-use of some graves which are more than 85 years old and verbal confirmation has been granted.

c) Allotments

- i) BTS scheduled to complete some maintenance work.
- ii) MM reported that both gates were broken, unsure if repairable. DC to investigate.

d) Play Area

- i) DC arranging replacement and repair of broken log and possible replacement of worn signage. 10 year warranty now up.
- ii) Mushroom seats to be repaired or replaced. DC to report back.

e) Public Footpaths

i) MM, on behalf of a parishioner, reported that footpaths to the South have not been reinstated. This will be monitored and landowners given time to reinstate.

- ii) MM to contact NWT regarding the closure of the wooden bridge across the stream.
- iii) DC reported that the stile on the footpath behind the Castle leading to the main road needs repair and the electric fence is too close to the hedge to allow access. Action AB.

f) Street Lights

Quotes from TT Jones to be considered for the dimming of the lights at midnight and shields to prevent glare into properties.

7. Community Car Scheme

- a) Gerry Walsh reported that OB Community Car Scheme has no coordinator and that paperwork is completed by the Responsible Financial Officer of the PC. GW currently looking at the budget, to discuss with AT. Six DBS checks due 2024.
- b) GW to resign at the end of the financial year but will offer support at handover. Currently low numbers of users. GW to investigate costings and viability of the scheme going forward.
- 8. Key Documents for Review
- a) To consider and review updated Data Protection Policy.
- b) To consider and agree updated Cllr responsibilities.
- c) PM to take responsibility for Allotments, Cemetery and become a member of the Community Project Fund Committee.
