The Next 20 Years

Last July the Parish Council decided to develop a neighbourhood plan that would guide the life and structure of New Buckenham over the next 20 years. The application to do this has now been published by Breckland Council. The documents can be seen at www.breckland.gov.uk/NewBuckenham. The area covered by the plan is not just the parish but also where the conservation area extends into Old Buckenham. This is to include Buckenham Castle and its immediate surroundings as they are inextricably linked to the history of the village. We are pleased to say that this proposal has the support of Old Buckenham Parish Council

The next stage is to consult everyone in the village about their views on how the village should be over the next 20 years, so in the Spring we will hold an open day at the village hall to launch the project. There will be lots of publicity and plenty of opportunity for everyone - yes everyone, young and old alike - to express their views in a major survey that will follow shortly after the launch.

Summary of January Draft Minutes

- 1. Chairman welcomed Trevor Wenham as the new Parish Clerk
- 2. PC resolved to approve draft Minutes of December meeting
- 3. Matters arising:-
- a) some potholes in Market Place have been filled, Highways will be contacted to fill remainder
- b) Tas Valley sign will be removed
- c) no response from PCSO regarding parking outside St Mary's. At times the area is congested with no space for ambulance access. Chair /Bella will try again
- 4. It was agreed to co-opt Steve Highton onto the Parish Council
- 5. Parishioners Comments
- a) concern expressed about speeding, HGV's and 'rat runs' through the village. Chair explained that help is sought from the PCSO
 b) the new edition of the biannual Villager Directory has been published and delivered, copies also available in the shop
- 6. District Councillor Report
- a) Breckland Council is switching to one main contact number 01362 656870
- b) residents and businesses are invited to comment on Breckland Council's draft budget for 2017/8. There will be a reduction of 25% this year and by 2020 there will be no settlement. They are planning for this by investing in revenue raising projects e.g. renewable energy, a cinema, a hotel and house building.
- c) he confirmed that current policy on mobile phone masts did not preclude the use of churches
- d) a resolution still being sought for Church Farm House
- e) Breckland Local Plan meeting 3rd Feb to consider responses. Cllr's invited to attend. Cllr Joel promised to represent their views especially the removal of New Buckenham 's development boundary
- 7. Parish Councillor Reports
 With the appointment of a permanent Parish Clerk, Cllr Dowson reported that she will resume the précis of Minutes in Parish News
