# The High Bailiffs Trust

Originally the High Bailiff was the steward of the Lord of the Manor and we believe that the two roles were combined in the late 19th or early 20th century, when Arthur Clowes purchased the title of Lord of the Manor. Just before his death he bequeathed it to his son Reginald; who then conveyed the title to Dr Tony Hamerton, who in turn bequeathed it to his son, Anthony. The Trust is responsible for the Market Cross, the Green (including Market Green), the village pump and the church clock. It was created in 1983 under a Charity Commission scheme which vested the property of the Charity in the Official Custodian for Charities. The principal responsibility of the Trust is the Market Cross and fortunately there was a major overhaul and refurbishment of the Cross in 1976. This was funded by grants and as a result has meant that maintenance has since been kept to a minimum. Major work in the last ten years has been the removal of the original carvings mounted on the outside walls, which after renovation were hung in the church in order to protect them from the ravages of weather. Replacement carvings hang on the Cross itself. The Christmas tree is lit using electricity from the Market Cross, which is also used as storage by the Players for props and scenery. You may have seen the sorry state of the green in old photographs. In 1976 the Trust had the green kerbed to make it impassable to traffic, (well almost) and since then it has been an asset, not an eyesore. We ensure the grass is cut regularly and this is our largest expenditure - it costs about £600 a year. There are many people who use the green, such as the village fete, St Mary's mini fete, jubilee celebrations and various people who use it for advertising. The village pump on the corner of Chapel Street has not worked for many years but is protected by 4 stout wooden posts. There was a second village pump located on the green and was summarily destroyed by the Highways Department, in less enlightened times, to create the bus stop. The Church clock is now electric so we no longer have to wind it by hand every other day. For many years maintenance was undertaken by Keith Mace and now he has moved, Steve Highton has volunteered to take over this duty and you'll have seen that the clock is now working again.

The membership of the Trust consists of five trustees:  
Chairman - Tony Hamerton, Treasurer - Peter Casson  
Parish council nominee - Karen Hobley  
Co-opted trustees - Steve Highton, - (We are currently looking to co-opt an additional trustee to fill a vacant position).

#### Finances

The Trust's regular expenses are insurance, grass cutting and weeding, and electricity to the Market Cross (standing charges plus lighting the Christmas tree) but the only regular revenue is the interest on its capital sum - and we all know how little that is these days. The Fundraisers kindly gave the Trust £150 from fete proceeds last year, for which we were extremely grateful. Occasional expenditure over the last few years has included trimming the Limes on Market Green and we had a new tree planted on the green, to replace one of the three trees that unfortunately died. We are currently working with the Parish Council to erect a new village notice board which will be located on the Green. We are fortunate that at the moment the village assets which the Trust maintains are in good order but we are aware that there will doubtless be the need in the future for some major capital expenditure.

# New Buckenham Manorial Lordship

Since the title of Lord of The Manor passed to me from my father some years ago I have been concerned that this historic responsibility, dating back to the time of William the Conqueror, should be passed to someone far more closely involved with New Buckenham life.

In considering what might have been my father's wishes I believe he would approve of my decision to pass on this Manorial Title to a person who is, not only his godson, but someone who has done a great deal to enhance village life.

It is with great pleasure that I have invited Peter John Casson to accept the transfer of this title and this was recently completed. In due course he will take over my duties as Chairman of the High Bailiff's Trust and I am sure that the land and buildings, under the management of the Trust, will be safe in his hands.

My father, believing that neither of his children contemplated settling in New Buckenham, made the decision in 1985 to pass ownership of New Buckenham Common to the then Norfolk Naturalist Trust in order to, in his words, "stop it falling into the hands of foreigners or absentee landlords". He also established the High Bailiff's Trust and transferred ownership of the village market cross, the village green, church clock and Village pump to the Trust rather than these remaining the property of the Lord of The Manor.

As such the title Lord of The Manor is considered an 'incorporeal hereditament' and the holder no longer receives any properties or benefits.

## New Buckenham Play Area

### Awarded a Breckland Community Grant

Youngsters in New Buckenham will soon enjoy a much-improved play area thanks to a funding boost from the district council.

Breckland Council will provide around half the necessary funding for the upgrade project, having given the green light to a £5,000 match funding bid from New Buckenham Parish Council. The money will be used to help deliver the play park improvement scheme, which is expected to cost a total of £10,051. The rest of the money will come from the parish council.

The project will see three new pieces of equipment for young children - a crawl tunnel, play train and speaking tubes - installed at the existing play area on Wymondham Road, replacing an outdated and underused toddler maze. The improvements will also see a three-person swing set installed for older children and it is hoped that the work will start over the summer.

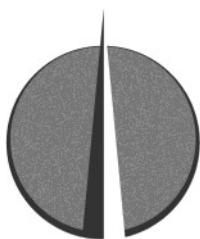

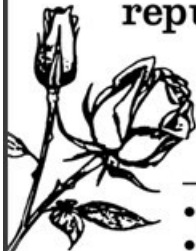
