Ways of Looking

There was a steady stream of visitors to the Bucks Photo Show at the Village Hall over the Bank Holiday weekend and, judging by the comments in the Visitors' Book, they were a very appreciative crowd!

I must confess to having something of a problem with photography. Like most people, I have a collection of packets of "snaps" of the "point & click" variety, which are lovely reminders of friends and family and occasions, but beyond that...?

This exhibition, with works by over 28 photographers, showed that there were many other ways of looking and seeing. There were close-ups, portraits, landscapes and townscapes, studies of the effects of light, images of the amazing beauty of the natural world of fur, feathers and flowers. Also to be seen were fine reminders of our industrial past and its depredations and glimpses of how we live and eat now.

Drone photography and the use of mobile phones have brought us a long way from the darkroom of old, but how I loved some of the black & white pictures. There was in them such a depth of texture, of light and shadow as to make them almost colourful.

It was good to see a collection of work from the students at Wymondham Academy. The images were interesting, thoughtful and sometimes playful; evidence of some serious work exploring the power of the image and how it can be controlled and manipulated. Great good stuff!

Congratulations to all the contributing photographers and to Charles and New Barts for arranging such an interesting show - and providing, as usual, the delicious cakes, tea and coffee to embellish the occasion.

It's been a busy year with much work carried out to maintain and improve the hall and facilities. Regular users will see improvements including the new kitchen door and a more robust tap for the kitchen sink. New thermostats have been fitted to radiators in the meeting rooms ready for the winter. Planned work to repair and decorate exterior woodwork should start in July. Trustees give their time to keep on top of all the jobs required to maintain a building for public use. One major job planned for this year is the re-varnishing of the auditorium floor. The cost for this floor restoration work will be paid from the 100 Club funds. Our thanks to all who contribute to the 100 Club and support the hall in this way. Ken has now retired and his contributions over many years are much appreciated. His time and dedication have ensured that we have the funds to complete big maintenance projects in the village hall. 
