

In 2016, Norman, an old friend of mine, died from motor neurone disease. Although he never had a driving licence, Norman loved old cars and had a sizeable collection in his barn in Wales. One of them was Jemima, a 1937 Morris Eight.

She had not been driven for some years and was not in good shape. I wanted to do something worthwhile in Norman's memory and arranged with his widow Ruth for Jemima to be brought over to the village for repairs at Mill House Garage. She is now back on the road and the plan is for Elly and me to drive her in August from John O'Groats to Land's End to raise funds for MND research.

The trip will take between ten days and a fortnight, breakdowns permitting. The MND Association are being very supportive and Jemima will be meeting branch volunteers en route and helping with local fundraising. After her journey, she'll be going back to Wales for a well-earned rest.

She'll be out and about between now and August at various events, including an appearance at the Forum in Norwich on 21st June as part of MND Awareness Day.

New Buckenham Parish Council

Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday 12th March at 7.30pm in the Village Hall. As ever, a warm welcome is extended to all parishioners.

A large amount of discussion time in meetings continues to be taken up by two major issues: parking in the village and dogs on the Play Area. Thank you to drivers in the village who have revised their parking arrangements following articles in previous issues of *Parish News*, but we still ask that people consider the following:

Those who park on the Lovells' crossroads or opposite St Mary's cause problems for all other drivers, but specifically the school bus, which drove across the Village Green on a number of occasions and has now had to change its route, and emergency vehicles, which may need access to St Mary's at all times. It was also noted that this parking is illegal (clearly stated in the Highway Code) and the council agreed to take this matter to the next SNAP meeting with the local police team.

We would also ask that you consider that the village shop depends both on villagers and on passing trade parking for a brief period and that if you intend to be in the village for a longer time, please be kind enough to park elsewhere.

The Council is currently reviewing signage over the Play Area but, again, I would ask that NO DOGS should be anywhere near the play equipment and that dog excrement in the surrounding areas should be immediately cleared up by owners and disposed of in the bin provided. Again, it is illegal to allow your dog to foul in a public place (Dog Fouling Act 1996) and offenders could be liable for fines of up to £1,000.

Thank you for your consideration in these matters!

Summary of Draft Minutes, February 2019

- Apologies were received from Cllr Manning and Cllr Highton.
- 2. Minutes of the January meeting were approved as correct.
- 3. Matters Arising none.
- 4. Public Participation
- a. Parishioners' Comments and Questions
 - i. parking outside St Mary's considered later.
 - ii. outsourcing of planning function to Capita considered detrimental as it was thought that those making decisions had no local knowledge but Cllr Joel said the arrangement was working satisfactorily from the perspective of Breckland Council.
- b. District Councillor's Report
 - i. Cllr Joel reported on a £4.95 increase in Band D Council Tax to £88.83 per year.
 - ii. a Breckworld tourism App is now available for download.

- c. Parish Councillors' Reports
 - i. Council noted with sadness that Brian Knappett a long-term village resident and allotment-holder had died.
 - ii. Cllr Bingham raised the issue of motorcycles speeding through the village as 'Two-Wheel Tuesday' will recommence soon. Bring up the issue at the next SNAP meeting and write to Police and Crime Commissioner.
- 5. Financial Matters
- a. Financial report to 31st January noted by Council.
- b. Payments for February were approved.
- c. Final budget and precept noted.
- 6. Planning

Council considered the following applications, applicants from a) and b) were asked to speak in support of their applications and members of the public were allowed to express their views.

- a. The Old Chapel, Chapel Street change of use to dwelling and first-floor extension. Resolved to approve this application as amended in the plans. The applicant proposed a further amendment which would retain the existing rear door and window with modifications and restoration. Concern over the problem of parking as there is no allocated parking space.
- b. Lovells, Market Place change of use to create 2 residential units. Council supported this application while noting there will be an impact on street parking as these properties have no usable off-street parking.

c. Bakehouse Cottage, King Street — demolition of existing covered porch and replacement with new covered porch. Council supported in principle whilst noting work had already begun and would want to be assured that materials appropriate for a Listed Building in a Conservation Area are used

7. Neighbourhood Plan

Charles Oxley gave an update on progress. Recent discussions had centred on parking, traffic and pavements. Concerns include parking, blocking access to emergency vehicles, especially outside St Mary's, perception of speeding vehicles through the village and excessive noise and vibrations from large trucks. Further investigations including measurements of pavements and roads will take place.

8. Parking/Speeding in the Village

Council considered representations from villagers regarding parking on The Green, speeding on Church Street and noting problems for delivery drivers and refuse collection. The following measures have been discussed. Traffic calming: expensive and of limited use. Yellow lines: the County Council has no money for additional parking restrictions. Traffic Regulation Orders are costly to implement and need public consultation. Enforcement is a District Council responsibility. The option of a non-enforceable white line to discourage parking especially outside St Mary's was suggested.

9. Amenities

a) Allotments: A request for a 7ft x 5ft shed to be erected on Plot 10 was granted.
