Dog Bite

On Tuesday 16th April at approximately 4:30pm I was bitten by a dog. This took place approximately a mile from the village in the quiet lanes. The dog was a medium-sized black terrier and it bit me on the back of my calf. The dog was on a long lead of purple rope and the walker said she was walking it for a friend and walked swiftly away.

My husband and I continued on our walk, but on arriving home the amount of blood flowing caused us to drive quickly to Attleborough Surgery which, luckily, was still open, where I was swiftly seen by a nurse. The wound was dressed, I was given a tetanus booster and a one-week course of preventative antibiotics.

The reason I am writing this letter is that I want to ensure that the owner is aware that the dog bites humans whilst on a lead, with no growling or barking to warn. Imagine if I had been a child — the recommendation from the police would be to destroy the dog. The owner should consider putting a muzzle on the dog.

I would also appreciate an apology from the dog owner.

I look forward to hearing from you. I hope the friend walking your dog told you about the incident.

Parish Farming News

Some of you will have heard that David Gladden passed away last Autumn, bringing to an end an era in which David and his late father Eric Gladden farmed in the parish since the 1930s, traversing the end of the horse drawn pre-war methods, up to modern mechanised systems. David Gladden was proud to have been involved with 73 harvests without a break and, as he mentioned to me a few weeks before he died, he and his late father farmed at Castle Farm and Hunts Farm for 83 years alongside their own adjoining land. (They followed on after my great uncle Harry, a vet). I remember David as keeping himself to himself, but always welcoming. His death marks the end of that generation of local farmers, of whom I remember Bill Jackson, Dennis Burton, Don Graham, Lennie Brewster, William Gaze. Johnnie Scales and others. As a child in the 1960s I well remember early morning milking, and the chug-chug-chug of the little stationary engines that punctuated the dawn and evening air driving the suction machines.

For now though, it is spring. You can sometimes see hares chasing across the large arable fields visible from the gate in the meadow behind the castle. Please do keep to public footpaths to avoid disturbing ground nesting birds, especially with dogs.

Parish Councillors reported on the following:

- a) Wheelie bins on pavements: In principle bins should only be left out on the day of collection and returned to the property after emptying. It was suggested that concerned residents speak to the homeowners concerned and offer to take their bins in if they required help.
- b) Potholes in Marsh Lane: Clerk agreed to report to Highways.
- c) Dog bins on the Common: It was suggested that more dog bins were needed on the Common as some dog walkers were leaving bags of faeces on the Common. Clerk to investigate costs.

5. Financial Matters

- a) Financial report to 31st March noted.
- b) Payments for April were approved.

6. Planning

a) Land off Cuffer Lane: Proposed Farm Building and Associated Works (Mr Charles Stimpson)

Resolved that the following comments be made: Parish Council has no planning objection subject to conditions requiring details of materials, elevation and surface water and foul drainage to be agreed with the planning authority.

b) Planning decision noted since the last meeting: The Old Chapel, Chapel St, planning approved.

7. Community Project Fund Grant Application

Council was advised that the Community Project Fund Group had considered an application from the New Buckenham Fundraisers for a grant to cover the cost of employing a central co-ordinator for community activities, to administer and promote activities and to cover costs for printing to promote community events. It is envisaged this be an extension to the current role of administrator for the VHT. The co-ordinator would be the central point of contact for organisations wishing to promote public events. The cost would be £600 p.a.: £400 for the co-ordinator and £200 printing costs. As this was revenue expenditure the capital element of the fund could not be used, but interest accrued on the Fund could be used for this purpose and therefore this was agreed by Council

8. Cricket Field Moles

Cllr Chirodian had investigated options for dealing with the problem. The only pest control company willing to deal with mole infestation on public land was Rentokil, quotation £1,238 plus VAT, and Council agreed to this. Rentokil will be working on the Common over the next few weeks. Warning signs will be erected when work is taking place. Humane methods will be used and there should be minimum hazard to users of the Common. The work is being commissioned for the purpose of health and safety, particularly in respect of players on the Cricket Pitch.

9. Parish Council Elections

Noted that Cllrs Hobley, Bingham, Crossman, Dowson, Highton and Manning had been re-elected unopposed, alongside Mr Paul Martin also elected unopposed. Council expressed thanks to Cllr Chirodian for her hard work as Parish Councillor.
