

Following government guidance and advice from Action with Communities in Rural England (ACRE), we have so far opened up our hall to the Oakley School of Dancing and the New Buckenham junior football club are back training on the pitch. We will be hosting the local elections on 6th May and the Parish Council will be returning to in-person meetings this month.

Meanwhile, we have been busy renovating and decorating our meeting rooms, toilets, corridor and entrance hall with new flooring and blinds being installed in the coming days. The trustees are hoping to host an opening event in the summer where we can invite the local community along to see our refreshed hall and share our thanks to those who have made this work possible. 

said he received about 200 emails each month and that significant items were passed to Councillors and if a decision was required this would be minuted.

b) Parish Cllr Reports

- i) A query was raised regarding infrastructure plans of County Broadband. Clerk to make an enquiry so that PC could be kept informed.
- ii) Cllr Bingham had a meeting with Highways regarding flooding at the Dam Brigg. Potential solutions were being costed.
- iii) Cllr Crossman agreed to turn the water supply on at the allotments.
- iv) Cllr Hobley questioned whether PC, as landlords, should have a copy of the Cricket Club's safeguarding policies. Clerk to investigate.

3. Financial Matters

- a) Financial report for March was noted.
- b) Payments for April were approved.
- c) A review of Financial Standing Orders and Financial Regulations is needed to take account of procedures for online banking. Clerk to bring a report to the June meeting.

4. Community Car Scheme

Gerry Walsh and the Clerk will get drivers certified to resume the service. In order to use DRB business solutions to deal with the DBS checks Council must have these policies in place: Handling of DBS Certificate Information and Policy Statement on the Recruitment of Ex-Offenders. Two template policies provided have been adopted by the Council.

5. Planning

a) New Applications

Wisteria House, Market Place - opening up historic access by removal of part of the hedge, demolition of existing shed to provide a parking area, installation of EV charging point, erection of new shed. No objection subject to Highways approval of vehicular access.

Kings Cottage, King Street - installation of steel support above existing beam in the lounge. No objection.

b) Planning Decision

St. Mary's Residential Care Home - rebuilding of small wall in front of property. Approved.

6. Neighbourhood Plan

Cllr Manning reported that the Basic Condition Statement had been returned from Breckland with comments that are currently being addressed.

7. Amenities

a) Allotments

The vacant plots have now been let. In view of the poor state of allotment 15 it was agreed that the rent for this year be reduced to £5. Concern raised about the shading by trees along Cuffer Lane, agreed to get BTS to quote for thinning and crown reduction. Tenancy Agreement was discussed and agreed that the present policy would suffice with the of a statement that when vacating an allotment the tenant should leave it in good condition.

b) Cemetery

Cemetery Rules were discussed, the main issue being lack of space will become a problem in the future but Cllrs agreed that restrictions should not be made and resolved to make no changes to the existing rules.

c) Market Place

In view of the substantial cost of renewal of the litter bins, Cllr Highton agreed to look into repairing/replacing the lids. Decision to be made at the next meeting.

d) Closed Churchyard

Repairs to the boundary wall, The Cottage, Church St. Further clarification being sought regarding the Party Wall Act which may indicate that repair responsibility lies with the Landlord of the cottage.

e) Play Area

The Safety Inspection has been carried out. No major issues were identified, but it gave an indication of a number of areas of work which will be required over the next few years requiring extra budgetary provision. Repairs to the roundabout will be carried out 26th April.

Cllrs agreed to purchase the Bee Maze sensory play equipment costing £335+VAT using \$106 funding.

f) Cricket Pitch/Moat Area

Issues have been raised regarding the maintenance of the Moat area. Work was asked to be curtailed until it could be discussed at the PC meeting. Agreed that a meeting will be arranged with Norfolk Wildlife Trust to discuss a way forward. After this, parishioners will be invited to form a working party to look at the whole area as part of the Neighbourhood Plan.

8. Future meeting arrangements

Emergency legal provision for online meetings expires on 7th May, so future meetings will be at the Village Hall. The Annual Parish Council Meeting (including election of Chair) is at 7pm on 11th May and the Annual Parish Meeting (for electors of the Parish, chaired by PC Chair) at is at 8pm 11th May.

The Ghost Pond

A new project for New Buckenham CAN

Spring is here — at last — and we would like to share our ideas for an exciting new project which we have been mulling over during the winter months. You might be surprised to know that there is an old overgrown pond behind the cricket pavilion. In fact, it may not be just old, but is possibly medieval, being part of the common village pond and waterway system. Such ancient forgotten ponds are poetically known as Ghost Ponds and are frequently found to be precious repositories for the seeds of plants that have become rare in our time. However, our ghost pond is currently in a sad state. It is choked with litter, including an old barrow and a fluorescent tube, and has become overgrown with marauding willow clumps and brambles, which are not only blocking out the light, they are also sucking all the life and water out of the pond.

At present, we are still trying to find out who is responsible for managing the pond. But with the support and cooperation of the Norfolk Wildlife Trust and the Parish Council, we envisage getting it cleared, aerated and redefined, transforming this forgotten and neglected corner of our village into an appealing and accessible habitat for local wildlife. This is going to be a long-term project and one for which we will need both professional advice and enthusiastic volunteers!

Until now, New Buckenham CAN has concentrated on planting trees as the cheapest, most efficient way to combat climate change, but our group is not only about trees! We also want to encourage biodiversity, which supports the well-being of plants, insects, birds, mammals - and of ourselves and our families. The unknown architects of these old ponds understood a lot about the workings of the natural world that
