Our July Parish Council meeting will take place on Tuesday 13th July at 7:30pm at the Village Hall. A warm invitation is extended to all parishioners.


We are delighted to be back at the Village Hall after an absence of over 12 months. Social distancing will be in place and masks will need to be worn. In order to assist us with the organisation of the meeting, please would you be kind enough to let me know if you wish to attend, using the details below or the link on the website. Thank you for helping us with this.

A reminder that the agenda relevant to each meeting will be posted on the noticeboard on the Village Green and on the website (www.newbuckenhampc.info) where you will also find further information about the Parish Council.

Parish Council meetings take place on the second Tuesday of every month with the exception of August when we don't usually meet. The remaining dates for 2021 are 14th September, 12th October, 9th November and 14th December.

At our last Parish Council meeting, there was some discussion about the problem of dog excrement around the Play Area and Cricket Pitch. There are disposal bins on the Wymondham Road and at the car park near the Play Area and we ask that dog owners ensure that they clear up after their dogs and use the bins provided. We are acutely aware that only a small minority of dog owners do not clear up and we ask that everyone respects the health and safety of youngsters on the Play Area, and the cricketers and spectators. Please be clear that no dogs should be anywhere near the equipment on the Play Area and not just within the fenced off toddlers' area. Thank you for supporting us with this — we are so lucky that New Buckenham has such a lovely area for play and sport and we want it to be enjoyed safely by all.

New Buckenham Neighbourhood Plan

The Neighbourhood Plan is a comprehensive account of the village and its life, setting out the Parish Council's policies about planning for the future. It's important! The Plan will be submitted to Breckland Council by the end of June. Running to some 76 fully-illustrated pages, it follows the same format as the version delivered to each household 18 months ago, but it's been extensively revised to correct errors and improve the narrative. Most importantly, it now takes into account all the comments and suggestions that we received during our consultation early in 2020.

The Plan will be subject to Breckland's formal public consultation, which starts in July. Breckland will publicise its consultation and we'll also do this within the village through posters and Facebook pages. The revised Plan will be online at **www.np4nb.online** and we'll have a limited number of copies printed for those who have no internet access. We hope that you'll have a look at the revised Plan and all your comments will be welcomed. All details will be in the publicity.

The Plan is accompanied by online-only documents including commissioned reports, a Basic Conditions Statement showing the rules have been kept in producing the Plan, and an informative Consultation Statement describing all the survey results, open days and focus groups.

After the consultation has finished, all the documents go to Breckland's independent examiner who checks everything, including the comments arising from the public consultation. When the examiner is satisfied that the Plan is valid as a legal planning document and due process has been observed in its creation, Breckland will hold a referendum for village residents to see if the Plan is acceptable to them. There'll be publicity about the referendum later when the date is known.

Whatever happened to the high speed high speed broadband roll out? County Broadband have notched up a seven-fold increase in their size and taken on their 100th employee. Thirty-six rural villages in Cambridgeshire are now about to get full fibre broadband, but what about New Buckenham? Attempts to get answers have failed, rather like the issue with the O2 phone mast. Thirty-three Norfolk villages were signed up last year, fifteen more were on board by spring 2021. CB Chief exec, Lloyd Felton, said he was backing Boris Johnson's pledge to achieve UK-wide gigabit-speed connectivity by 2025. But despite calls and emails there have been no answers to the question 'what is happening'?
