Village Hall News: March 2022

We are really pleased to announce that the village hall is busy at the moment as we are beginning to come out of Covid restrictions. But unfortunately just as we welcome our community back into the hall, after 25 years of service the boiler packed up.

We knew it had to be replaced and it was in the schedule of works for the coming summer months, but Trustees needed to act quickly on this one. We considered a like-for-like replacement oil-fired boiler. However, with the green agenda and our wish to future proof the hall we also considered the alternative of electric heating with an air source heat pump (ASHP). Whilst ASHP on its own would not meet the heating demands of the hall we have installed a hybrid unit combining both ASHP and oil fired boiler.

This future-proofs the hall and meets our agenda of reducing our carbon footprint. This solution will make the most of the solar power generated by the halls PV panels. It is a very new product made by Grant boilers and can be converted to use HVO (hydrogenated vegetable oil) in the future.

With help from our generous legacies and support from the Parish Council Community Fund we are pleased to let you know the new boiler is in and operational. We hope that this one will serve us well for the next 25 years.

Summary of Draft Minutes February 2022

Present: Andrew Bingham (AB Vice Chair), Mary Dowson (MD), Mary Manning (MM), Don Crossman (DC), Andrew Nettleton (AN), Angela Thornton (Clerk, AT).

1. Minutes of the January meeting agreed as correct with one minor correction.

2. Matters Arising

AN to write an article in *Parish News* to highlight the Community Project Fund.

Cuffer Lane potholes: no response from Highways.

County Broadband: Chair has re-established contact and is waiting for a response.

Marsh Lane: work ongoing.

Electric car: AB to write an article in *Parish News* and to be put on agenda at the Annual Parish Meeting.

3. Public Participation

District/County Cllr: Reported that the owner of Downmore Farm had contacted him to say that work had started on the mobile phone mast.

Parish Cllr Reports: MM noted the dog waste bin on the corner of the cricket pitch was over full. Schedule and frequency of collection to be investigated.

4. Parishioners' Comments and Questions

Sue Britton requested that a defibrillator be purchased. PC explained that it had been investigated before and suggested if SB could bring a proposal including location, management and ongoing costs and maintenance they would consider its purchase.

5. Financial Matters

Financial report for January was noted.

Payments for February were approved.

Community Project Fund application from the village hall has been discussed by the Project Group. They recommended that PC contribute £5,000 towards the Village Hall project to reduce its carbon footprint by installing a hybrid air-source and oil boiler.

PC decided not to approve the quote (£400) to refurbish the old metal bench and it will instead be offered to the highest bidder.

6. Planning Applications

Corner Cottage, Market Place: Existing stair to be replaced and rotated 180 degrees within the existing stairwell. No objection.

Aviary House, King Street: Conversion of outbuilding to form a new dwelling. No objection, but requested the impact on car parking to be noted by Breckland.

Planning Decision: 8 Chapel Street: Permission.

7. Amenities

Closed Churchyard: grass has been raked and collected. Quinquennial Report is under review with plan and costings to be prepared. AT to request a meeting with the PCC.

Cemetery: review of charges to be deferred until AN and MD have identified all available plots in the old part of the cemetery.

Allotments: one outstanding invoice and allocation of available plots progressing.

Play Area: the Bee Maze has been installed.

8. Queen's Platinum Jubilee

PC encourage events to celebrate and an article will go in *Parish News*.

Community Car Scheme
 Grant application has been submitted to Breckland DC.

10. Neighbourhood Plan

Nothing to report. Plan still with Breckland DC.
