New Buckenham Parish Council

April's Parish Council Meeting will take place on Tuesday 12th April at the Village Hall. Please note that this will start at 7pm and will be followed by our Annual Parish Meeting at 8pm. This will be an opportunity to hear about the work of the Parish Council over the past 12 months, including updates on various projects, and plenty of opportunities for discussion and to ask questions about our work. All parishioners are warmly invited to attend either or both meetings.

One of the projects which we have been discussing over the last few months is the restoration of the old bench at the cemetery gate. A number of people expressed disappointment at our decision to sell it but we were able to review that decision after Clive Rush very kindly offered to restore it for us, free of charge, and the High Bailiff's Trust volunteered to support us with re-siting it. For those of you who are unaware, the bench has a plaque to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of King George V in 1935 and the Parish Council has agreed to purchase a second plaque for it, commemorating the Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II. Hopefully, it will be part of New Buckenham's heritage for many more years. Thank you to everyone who has offered support with this project.

The Parish Council is also looking at providing a defibrillator for the village. Sue Britton (susanjanebritton@gmail.com / 01953 861406) has kindly agreed to look into the logistics of this and is investigating a suitable site, costs, maintenance and insurance. I do know that Sue has already had some kind offers of help but, if you feel you can support the project in any way, please contact Sue or myself. I know that, if we are successful with this project, we will need a rota of people to check the defibrillator regularly - batteries, pads etc. Do please get in touch if you can help. Thank you.

Also, at our Annual Parish Meeting, Andrew Bingham will be interested to hear people's views on an electronic car point and car

for the village, there will be an update on the Neighbourhood Plan and we are currently trying to contact a representative from County Broadband to come and speak to us about progress in the village.

We look forward to seeing you on 12th April and we hope you will take the opportunity to join us to hear about all our current initiatives, ask questions and take part in the discussions.

Summary of Draft Minutes Marc,h 2022

Present: Karen Hobley (KH, Chair), Andrew Bingham (AB), Mary Manning (MM), Mary Dowson (MD), Steve Highton (SH), Don Crossman (DC), Andrew Nettleton (AN) and Steve Askew (SA, County/District Cllr). Stevie Hobley: Minutes.

1. Minutes

Minutes of the last meeting approved with two minor corrections: Payments list NPower changed to Eon, MD to write article in PN not AB.

2. Matters Arising

AN has submitted an article about the Community Project Fund to PN.

DC reported some work had been done on potholes in Cuffer Lane.

Contact had been established with County Broadband. Clerk has invited them to attend a PC meeting.

Marsh Lane roadworks underway. The road closure has caused issues with bin collections, but works should be finished at the weekend.

Village gateway - ongoing.

George V bench – there is a lot of feeling that the bench should remain in the village. It was agreed to give the bench to the High Bailiff's Trust and if funding is required they apply to the Community Project Fund. KH proposed to obtain a new plaque in addition to the George V one to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

3. Public Participation

District/County Cllr

Queen's Jubilee - from April 1st funding of up to £500.00 is available for other bodies (not PC) to access.

No further progress on the Dambrigg.

Telephone mast, work has begun.

Cuffer Lane planning application has been extended into April. If the application is rejected the PC would request the site restored. AB to investigate a Request for Enforcement.

There are large potholes on the road leading to the village hall but it has never been established who owns it. The PC will look into costings to repair it. AB to get quotes.

Parishioners' Comments

Sue Britton presenting the case for a defibrillator. Running costs: pads every 18 months £20-30, battery every 4 years £150. Cost of the defibrillator itself from £700 upwards, average £1000. Insurance costs unknown.

MD: money was not the issue. It is the location, management and administration of the device.

Sue Britton stated a possible location may have been found but not confirmed, it would need to be on an outside wall, in a locked box and registered with EoEAS.

Five parishioners have offered support for it's maintenance.

MM: training in its use is available although the call handler and the device will give clear instructions.

AB: to look at which budget it would come from.

KH: proposed that a written proposal, including location, rota and costs including installation from Sue would be welcome at the April meeting.

4. Financial Matters

Financial Report was noted.

Payment report was a duplicate of last month, but payments to Robin Steel, A & V Baker, VHT and Stevie Hobley for minuting this meeting were agreed.

AB: will be unavailable for 2-3months, DC agreed to deputise as a named person for online banking.

5. Planning

Hunt's Farm planning application has been approved.

6. Amenities

Closed Churchyard – Quinquennial Report. It was noted that a meeting took place between representatives of the PCC and PC to establish their shared responsibilities. Agreed that the PCC would maintain the two sheds and that the Churchyard grounds would be maintained by the PC.

Three areas were discussed: the formal flower beds, the lawns and grassy paths and the conservation area. It was suggested that the conservation area be reduced in size and a gardener sought to help with this. It was hoped to organise a group of volunteers to assist with some routine garden clearance. It was

also agreed that the PC would undertake minor repairs to the steps and hand rail by the South door.

Cemetery – Agreed to defer review of charges until April. Rodding of the 'old' cemetery to go ahead in late April.

Allotments – One outstanding allotment rent, DC to investigate. An allotment holder who has left the village has requested an extension to clear their site.

7. Community Car Scheme

Annual grant received.

8. Neighbourhood Plan

The examination is complete and it has the status of a planning document. Breckland will decide when it goes forward for the referendum.

Bizz Buzz

It really might soon be happening! Can you believe it?

At last, positive action on the phone mast for New and Old Buckenham... Just in case you hadn't caught the latest news about the new phone mast (which was confirmed by O2 on the 3rd March – typically just too late for the *Parish News*) here's the update... but as we in Biz Buzz always say: DON'T HOLD YOUR BREATH!

Works have commenced on the base station at Downmore Farm. There can be no total certainty about the build schedule, but O2 believe that all the relevant works are expected to be completed by June. This includes the physical build and then a period of network integration and testing. And this means that if all goes well the mast would be fully operational by June.

Be aware, as Biz Buzz has constantly warned, the network services provided from this site will be for O2 only. It's possible that other providers could buy their way onto the mast, but there is no indication at the moment that this is happening.

The High Bailiff's Trust

The High Bailiff's Trust have asked Phil Anderson to have a look at the limes on the Market Place and he recommends that the crowns be cleaned and the deadwood and dieback be removed. Also, that the trees be reduced in height so that they are all of uniform height.

This work will allow some additional light through to the grass and will not affect the snowdrops that have been planted any more than is absolutely necessary. We have left it to Phil to commence the work as the trees are in a conservation area and permission needs to granted before work can commence.

Having sought advice from the Norfolk Wildlife Trust and others, we have also decided that we will continue to manage the area surrounding the limes in the same manner as the rest of the Market Place. We are very grateful to Kim Cutmore for her ideas and enthusiasm for giving this ground over to wildflowers, but following a trial period have decided that this is not appropriate in this location. Historic Buildings of New Buckenham

Starting about 20 years ago many of the older houses in New Buckenham received unusual visitors! They rummaged around in lofts, measured everywhere, made numerous drawings, took photographs and bored holes in the ancient beams.

The Norfolk Historic Buildings Group is a voluntary group whose passion is vernacular buildings. It spent several years surveying buildings in New Buckenham as the first of their studies of vernacular houses in a village context. The survey results include work by the late Paul Rutledge, a local resident, and a book was published in 2005. Its final section describes the detailed construction of each house surveyed and discusses the dates of building uncovered by dendrochronology. This is a technique involving the analysis of ring patterns in the oak beams.

The book was on sale for several years before selling out. Reprinting a short run was not feasible, so we are delighted that the NHBG has now made the work available for everyone to read online or download via the New Buckenham Archive website:
