

## New Buckenham Community Car Scheme – Help Wanted

### **VOLUNTEER DRIVERS**

We are seeking to recruit drivers to join our team of seven volunteers (including myself). If you are a car driver and owner who would like to contribute to our village community and have some available time in the week, but not wanting to commit to a regular day or time or committee, this could be ideal voluntary work for you.

Financial remuneration is paid at a rate of 45p per mile. Half the cost is paid direct to the driver by the service user and the remaining met through an annual grant from Breckland Council and NB Parish Council, administrated by the scheme's coordinator.

### SCHEME COORDINATOR

As a long-standing driver for the scheme, I stepped into the coordinator role a year ago in an acting capacity to maintain it following the death of the previous incumbent (Violet Highton). Due to personal commitments, I am unable to continue in this role after the end of the year and we are needing to find a new coordinator as soon as possible. The Car Scheme is a highly valued and needed village service for those who do not have access to transport to attend medical and health (physical and mental) appointments.

Ongoing support and guidance in this voluntary role will be available from myself and the Parish Council. Being a car driver / owner is not essential for this role.

I would be very pleased to hear from anyone interested in finding out more about either or both roles and the tasks involved. For an informal chat please call on 861 027.

### **Village Hall News**

Like everyone now the Village Hall Trust has been looking at the cost of energy needed to heat and light the Village Hall. As our current contract comes to an end we are looking potentially at a 500% increase in electricity costs. There may be some help from the Government on this, but details are unclear at the moment.

Over the last year the Trustees have invested in insulation and updated to energy efficient lighting which should be a help. We also offset some of our electricity costs with solar generated power, but we need to minimise our electricity usage. The new boiler operates most efficiently by maintaining a low but constant temperature through the Hall. To maintain this, we need to ensure windows are closed and doors not left propped open.

We hope all those who use the Hall will be mindful of energy use, as we are at home and work. We have always aimed to cover our outgoings from our income, but this might not be possible this winter and we may have to dip into those precious reserves used to maintain the fabric and facilities in the Hall.

Please be energy aware and help us to keep the Village Hall as warm and as bright as we can afford.
