

The Parish Council does not meet in August, so our next Parish Council meeting will be held on Tuesday 12th September at 7:30pm at the Village Hall. A warm welcome is extended to all parishioners. If any issues arise in August, please do contact me as parish councillors will be available to help and support.

Our remaining meetings for 2023 take place on 10th October,14th November and 12th December.

We continue to focus on speeding issues. A Parish Partnership application for the Village Gateway has to be completed by November 2023. NCC has advised us that a proposed speed reduction on the B1113 is not viable. We are awaiting information on 'Child-shaped' bollards. Some people have purchased 'Slow Down' stickers for wheelie bins, which are available from Amazon. The Speedwatch training will hopefully have taken place by the time this edition of *Parish News* is published. We are committed to our focus on speeding and would be delighted to hear your thoughts and ideas!

Some good news is that our defibrillator project has finally been completed after, I admit, many ups and downs. It should be arriving within the next few days and will be installed on the side wall of the King's Head. Many thanks to Simon from the King's Head who has enabled the project to go ahead by offering support when we were struggling to find a suitable position for the defibrillator.

Sue Britton has previously compiled a list of volunteers who will carry out regular checks on the defibrillator. If you have volunteered, please would you be kind enough to confirm to Sue or myself that you are still happy to do this and we can make plans for a rota? Thank you and thanks to Sue for her help with the project.

Summary of Draft Minutes July 2023

Present: Karen Hobley (KH; Chair), Mary Manning (MM), Mary Dowson (MD), Andrew Bingham (AB), Steve Askew (SA; District and County Cllr) and Angela Thornton (AT; Clerk).

1. Minutes of the June meeting confirmed as correct.

2. Matters Arising

- a) Village Gateway: Action AB to complete Parish Partnership application process and submit by November 2023.
- b) Defibrillator: order placed. Sue Britton and volunteers' names to be passed to Parish Clerk.
- c) County Broadband Wayleave Agreement: still with solicitors.
- d) Establishment of community woodland working group: the group met to assess potential sites. Costings and potential sites to be brought to PC. Action AB.
- e) Electric Charging Point: awaiting NCC site survey to assess viability.
- f) Cuffer Lane Planning: ombudsman process investigated, no further right of appeal. Site to be monitored.

3. Public Participation

a) Parish Cllrs

KH explained that NCC advice suggests any proposal to speed reduction on the B1113 is not viable. The damaged bollard in King Street has been repaired, but there were concerns about the quality of the repair. AT to report to Highways.

The defibrillator will need some electrical work when placed on the wall at the King's Head - KH to liaise. AB requested that trees need to be trimmed around the streetlights especially on Castle Hill Road. Action AT.

b) District/County Cllr

SA reiterated that the speed reduction request is not viable. He advised that the Mobile Food Bank will be available in Old Buckenham shortly. Information to go in Parish News and on the New Buckenham Facebook site.

c) Parishioners

Two parishioners were present and left at 8:15pm. Requested an update on the community wood. AB to progress in the summer to identify landowners and potential sites. Requested an update on electric charging points – NCC to survey.

4. Financial Matters

Bank reconciliation for June approved.

Payments for July and August approved.

5. Planning

No objection to the call for an increase in traveller sites in South Norfolk.

6. Amenities

a) Closed Churchyard

Some clearing along the wall has taken place. MM requested the skirt of the lime tree be removed . Action AT. Period Pointing will be continuing repairs to the flint wall for two weeks starting July 17th.

b) Cemetery

Registration on the Diocesan system is in place to allow re-use of some graves which are more than 85 years old.

c) Allotments

Thanks to Ellis Williamson and John Hobley for replacing valves which has significantly increased water pressure.

NBPC to review the allotment policy at the September meeting.

d) Play Area

DC arranging replacement and repair of broken log and possible replacement of worn signage.

5. Public Footpaths.

Footpath number two stile - to request Barbara Cattermole to contact Ramblers to replace stile with a gate.

6. Correspondence

Parishioner email re Street Lighting discussed. Some parishioners have requested lights removed / turned off to reduce costs and glare. Other parishioners request lights remain unchanged for safety and security. AT to obtain quotes for shields to reduce glare and the reduction of brightness at midnight.

Life Under The Limes

There are more than twenty-five different species of wildflowers under the lime trees on Market Place. Several have matured, produced flowers, gone to seed then died back making room for other plants to take their place.

Common Daisy and Ox-Eye Daisy: The name 'daisy' is a corruption of 'day's eye'. As the daisy opens its petals at the beginning of the day its yellow 'eye' is revealed. At the end of the day the petals fold over closing the 'eye'. So long as the autumn and winter are mild the common daisy will flower all year with each individual flower lasting five to ten days.

The ox-eye daisy is almost three times the size of the common daisy and can grow to 3' tall. They are great value in the garden flowering for five months from May to September. As the petals die back the yellow 'eye', taking energy from the plant, ripens into seed. When the flowers look dead, brown and dry the seed is ready to be collected.

The common daisy was believed to be the spirit of children who had died during or soon after birth with the flowers springing up to comfort the parents. According to Norse legend, the daisy represents Freya, the goddess of love and fertility. So, the daisy symbolises childbirth, motherhood and new beginnings. Remember playing 'he loves me, he loves me not' and making daisy chains and garlands? A garland around the head of a baby was said to protect it from being stolen by the fairies and replaced with a changeling child.

Along with its spiritual associations with children and innocence, medicinally the daisy was also know as 'bruisewort' a homeopathic cure for bruises during childbirth. According to Maud Grieve in *A Modern Herbal* (1931), the daisy was used as an 'antispasmodic diuretic and tonic'. The ox-eye daisy was apparently successful in treating whooping cough, asthma and 'nervous excitability'.

Daisies also provide valuable pollen and nectar for bees, butterflies and beetles. Earwigs eat the petals and snails, slugs, rabbits and deer eat the whole plant. There has definitely been evidence of deer and rabbits under the lime trees!

Cow Parsley: Appearing as early as April and flowering until June is cow parsley in all its abundant glory, growing up to 4' tall. I fell in love with it over 40 years ago as it turned The Great Churchyard in Bury St Edmunds into a magical and mysterious place.

Two years ago, when the cow parsley was at its best under the lime trees, a delighted little said it was 'like an enchanted forest'.

I have been unable to find a satisfactory reason for the 'cow' part of its name although cow parsley is, as its name says, amongst the parsley family of plants.

Cow parsley has many other names including 'Queen Anne's Lace'. While walking with her ladies-in-waiting Queen Anne (1665 to 1714) said the plant reminded her of the lace pillows her ladies carried. Were these pillows for making the handmade lace which adorned the cuffs of the queen's dress?

A less romantic name is 'mother die'. It is likely this is to deter children from picking cow parsley as it so closely resembles the highly poisonous hemlock. Looking very like cow parsley is hogweed, a harmless native wild flower. Not to be confused with giant hogweed which is not native to this country.

Although awe-inspiring and up to 10' tall giant hogweed is an incredibly toxic and dangerous plant which should not be touched at all. For a short history about giant hogweed and the fear it can instil, listen to 'Nursery Cryme' by Genesis, 'The Return of the Giant Hogweed'.

As well as its wonderful ethereal quality, as an early source of pollen cow parsley is an important host for up to 40 insects including bees

and hoverflies. Even after flowering, cow parsley should be left as food for goldfinches who eat the seed.

Medicinally, cow parsley was used to treat stomach, kidney and breathing difficulties. It has also been used as a mosquito repellent. Cow parsley has also been used, fresh or dried, as a seasoning. The young leaves, roots and stems can also be eaten.

I wouldn't advocate eating or using any of these plants as a cure or to eat, but it is interesting to learn how these common and readily available plants have been used in the past.
