New Buckenham Parish Council

Our February Parish Council meeting will take place on Tuesday 13th February at 7:30pm in the Large Meeting Room at the Village Hall. A warm welcome is extended to all parishioners.

A reminder that the agenda relevant to each meeting will be posted on the noticeboard on the Village Green and on the website (www.newbuckenhampc.info) where you will also find further information about the Parish Council meeting dates for 2024: 12th March; 9th April; 14th May; 11th June; 9th July; 10th September; 8th October; 12th November; 10th December. The Parish Council does not meet in August.

As I'm sure most people are aware, the Parish Council has a Project Fund which awards grants towards new or existing community-based activities in the Parish of New Buckenham or activities of the designated organisations of New Buckenham (e.g., the designated schools for New Buckenham are Old Buckenham Primary School and Old Buckenham High School). We have recently been delighted to support applications from the New Buckenham Fundraisers and St. Martin's Church. Full details of the Project Fund and an application form are on our website. Grant Applications are considered by a monitoring group which makes recommendations to the full council and is made up of three Parish Councillors and two parishioners. We currently have a vacancy for a parishioner as Sarah Nash has resigned from the group. Please contact me if you need further details in order to make an application to the Project Fund or would be interested in joining the monitoring group to review new applications.

I am pleased to report that New Buckenham's defibrillator is now installed on the side wall of the King's Head. Thank you, Simon. Please note that if the defibrillator is needed, your first action **must** be to call 999. You will then be given the code to unlock the cabinet and Ambulance Control will stay on the line until an ambulance is with

you. Once switched on, the defibrillator itself will also talk you through what needs to be done.

Thanks to everyone who has supported this project in so many different ways. Unlike other facilities in the village, this is one which we fervently hope will never be needed.

Summary of Draft Minutes January 2024

Present: Karen Hobley (KH), Chair; Mary Manning (MM); Paul Martin (PM); Andrew Bingham (AB); Don Crossman (DC); Steve Highton (SH); Mary Dowson (MD); Angela Thornton (AT), Clerk.

Also in attendance, 2 parishioners.

1. The Chair congratulated AT on obtaining her Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA) qualification.
2. Minutes of the December meeting confirmed as correct.
3. Matters Arising
 - a) Village Gateway: awaiting outcome of Parish Partnership application process.
 - b) County Broadband Wayleave Agreement: still with solicitors.
 - c) Establishment of community woodland: 1st-choice potential site unavailable. 2nd site not viable. 3rd choice still under investigation.
 - d) Electric Charging Point: NBVHT confirmed it is going ahead.

- e) NBPC email services: awaiting instructions from NCC.
- f) KH contacted Norfolk Wildlife Trust regarding the removal of the electric fence around the edge of the Common. AB to contact the grazier.
- g) The large area of standing water in Church Street has been reported to Steve Askew (SA).

4. Public Participation

a) Parish Cllrs

- i) KH confirmed that she will not be standing for re-election as Chair in May 2024.
- ii) AB reported that footpaths to the south of the village have not been reinstated. AB to contact the landowner.
- iii) The Dambrigg has flooded again. AB suggested to contact SA to report to Highways. Action AT.
- iv) DC requested the purchase of an additional dog bin at the far end of the Common as the current bin is constantly overflowing. Action AT.
- v) MM reported that the bridge on footpath 2 has been dislodged by floodwater. Action AB, MM and DC.
- vi) MM agreed to review the impact of the Neighbourhood Plan and compile a 6 monthly progress report.

b) Parishioners

Dr Richard Hoggett and Katie Wyatt-Hupton, both editors of Parish News, described the financial pressure facing its publication and the difficulty in securing a reliable income stream. Given the support it provides for Council business they invited the Council to consider adopting the publication as a 'council amenity' or to provide support with an annual grant. KH proposed a grant of £1,500 for 2024/5. All agreed.

5. Financial Matters

- a) Bank reconciliation for December approved.
- b) Budget monitoring for 3rd quarter considered and noted.
- c) Council considered a Community Project Fund application from the PCC for a contactless payment device and plinth for the church. A sum of £478 was agreed for purchase of the device, delivery and installation and construction of the plinth.

6. Planning

An application for Ivy House, Market Place was discussed. No objections made.

7. Amenities

a) Closed Churchyard

- i) Repairs to the roof of a neighbouring property have led to concern of water ingress into the flint wall. Action DC.
- ii) Three bushes have been planted without the permission of the Council. MD to investigate.
- iii) Compost bin still to be relocated. Action AT.

b) Cemetery

Notices are in place to allow re-use of graves.

c) Allotments

- i) 3 of the vacant plots have been allocated. The state of the 4th plot is a concern and it was agreed the former owners should be asked to restore it to an acceptable condition. Action AT.
- ii) AT agreed to ensure responsible Cllrs are informed of new tenants.

iii) A new tenant has requested permission to keep hens. Cllrs did not think this was appropriate, so refused.

d) Play Area/Cricket Pitch

i) Pressure washing of play equipment to be done before Easter. Action DC.

ii) Cricket Club to be asked to remove temporary fencing from the perimeter of the pitch. Action AT.

e) Defibrillator

Monitoring schedule in place.

8. Key documents

Review deferred to February meeting.

9. Correspondence

A discussion took place relating to the Clerk's working conditions following her completion of CiLCA. Clerk to be on point 21 of the National Pay Scales, working 8 hours per week from February 2024.

The community car service is provided by 'vetted' voluntary car drivers from the village, to enable those not able to access transport for non-emergency health-related journeys such as hospital/GP/optician/dental or other health appointments. The journey fare is charged at 45p per mile with the service user paying half the cost direct to the driver with the other half paid out of a grant from Breckland Council and the Parish Council. We currently have seven volunteer drivers, including the co-ordinator.

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
